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Irma Esbil 26 Linen Avenue Bridgeport, CT 06604	Excessive Loud Music
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Ms. Esbil stated that she lived in the hollow community and she owns a 4-family house. She expressed she had a quality of life issue living near the Vasco de Gama Portuguese Social Club. She recalled that during the 4th of July weekend, there is a three day celebration where they have an outdoor DJ and band. They plan from 9:00 am until 2:00am that is excessive. She expressed that although she loved the holiday, in the last five years she has dreaded it, due to the excessive loud noise and music from the constant playing of the band and DJ and it's not fair. In the past she has called the police and she was told the music would stop at different times, but it never did. She has also spoken to district Council member dePara who said that he enjoyed the celebration, but then he goes home to sleep. She asked Council member dePara to find out about the ordinance.

Council President McCarthy stated that she should stay in contact with the district council members about the issue.

Clyde Nicholson 54 Wallace Street Bridgeport, CT 06606	Schools
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Mr. Nicholson said he was there to ask the council to intervene in the public school situation. This was in reference to school cuts that will directly affect the student, especially in the poor neighborhoods. He asked the council to look into what they're doing. He noted the \$233 million budget, but over the years, he hasn't seen any changes going into effect.

And now they are planning on cutting (144) teachers and 4,320 students are being moved to already crowded schools. He further spoke about the (450) students from Dunbar School being relocated and the problem of them going to Tisdale School that is already crowded. In addition, there are (550) students being moved from Roosevelt School to another district. He said that although he never used the race card before, he felt this situation involved racism. He stressed that the needs of the children and the parents are being sorely affected. His deepest concern was that as a taxpayer, he would appreciate the courtesy of having the matter addressed and followed up on. He noted that the BOE taking the money and doing what they wanted is against the law. He further stressed that some strings have to be attached to assure fairness. He urged Council President McCarthy to get involved in the BOE process.

Council member McCarthy explained that the point of public session was to listen to the public voice their concerns. He told Mr. Nicholson that he should leave his phone number with Mr. White who would contact him to discuss the matter further. He stated that the law limits the city council in the power they have with the Board of Education. Mr. Nicholson said he thought the law should be changed then. He emphasized the importance of education.

She said the police patrol on Platt Street doesn't do anything to observe what's going on and she felt this should correct with more police involvement. She also mentioned other criminal activity that is present at the senior complex. She emphasized that it was unfair that since the citizens pay the police officers salaries, she thought they should provide more service like they do in other municipalities. She ended to say she would like more involvement.

She said she has observed pictures of the area, with toilet paper wrapped around trees and other garbage and debris. She noted that the dam is right in the middle of her backyard and it

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smells horribly. She updated that there were six new houses built on Valley Avenue that have cesspools hooked up and that is what's causing the problems. She said she called to complain but no one came out to check the problems. She stressed that the stench was so strong, you have to hold your breath when you come outside. She also mentioned that she was upset about Verna Kearny being removed from the Senior Community Service. She was a caring person and an advocate for seniors in many ways, such as cooking for them etc.

Mr. Kohut read from a statement he prepared. The highlights of the statement outlined quality of life issues regarding public safety concerns and senior issues. He said this was a problem affecting many along different income lines and public safety is inadequate in certain areas in the city; such as on Old Town Road. There is also a traffic congestion problem in the area. He requested that there be more police presence in the areas that need it. He further spoke about seniors with disabilities and senior wellness programs that are needed. He spoke about the flooding conditions in the north end that causes serious damage in many north end neighborhoods, thus affecting the resale value of homes. He went on to address domestic violence issues in view of recent situations that have occurred in the news.

Barnum - *it was noted that the video would be submitted to Tom White for the record.* Mr. Young explained the problems that the raw sewage creates; such as slush, water and damage to the pipes. He expressed that he came in peace tonight and he mentioned that what happened last month during the city council meeting should have never happened. He asked the council to address the raw sewage problem.

The agenda returned to item *74-09 Economic and Community Development and Environment Committee Report re Section 108 Seaview Plaza Project: Substantial Amendment to the City's Consolidated Plan for Housing and Community Development.

Council member dePara stated that the item came of committee with a unanimous vote as amended.

Council member Walsh commended the committee for the work they did on the resolution and the changes that were made to it, in regard to the concern about borrowing against block grant money. He said it was amended to require that paperwork come back to the committee before the final approval. There was also a concern about the Section 108 loan and the potential for losing money. He said he was looking forward to reviewing the loan documents and LDA before the final approval.

Council member Holloway stated that each year they lose 20% from block grant money. He recalled that he tried to explain this to his constituents who thought he was against the resolution. However, he was assured that the block grant money would be secured per Alanna Kabel and the money will be paid back by the developer. He expressed that this was the first time something like this had been done.

Council member dePara expressed that Council member Holloway's wisdom was appreciated by the way his concern was conveyed to the committee and constituents. He felt that him bringing the matter forward, resulted in the drafting of a better resolution. There are two stop gaps to assure that the money is paid back and that it will be secured. In addition, it will come back to the city council before it's finalized.

Council member Baker stated that he was glad they would be able to review the document before the final approval. And although he was glad the district was moving forward, it was good that they will be able to review the document before its finalized.

73-09 Miscellaneous Matters Committee Report re Appointment of Anne Pappas Phillips (D) to the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Council member T. McCarthy deferred to Council member Vizzo-Paniccia to present the item on his behalf since he chaired the committee meeting.

Council member Vizzo-Paniccia stated that the item passed in committee with two members in opposition .

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**COUNCIL MEMBER VIZZO-PANICCIA MOVED TO APPROVE
COUNCIL MEMBER BRANTELY SECONDED**

Council member Walsh stated that he was one of the two people that were opposed to approving the item in committee. He explained it was because some of the facts about the appointment were found to be troublesome, due to alternate members assuming full powers of a regular committee member. He recalled that in the ordinance, there must be a written opinion from the city attorney and there is a policy of alternates waiting 180-days to serve. In this case, there were serious concerns about the decision. He stated that some items in the appointee's background were problematic. The appointee was asked if they were aware of the ordinance and then they were asked about a prior article in the CT Post dated May 16, 2009 that was six months before the lawsuit and where the appointee was quoted in the article. He stressed that the appointee's claim of being unaware of the article was insulting. At any rate, there is a charter discrepancy, as to what the council was previously told. He said he wouldn't have a problem with the appointee serving on another committee, but not the land use committee.

Council member Holloway felt there was a problem of a failure to communicate. He thought the Ethics Commission was responsible for screening problems for prospective appointees. He stated that it seemed the Ethics Commission came out in flying colors for Ms. Pappas; so he felt they should vote what the Ethics Board decided upon. And in view of that, they are only approving what the Ethics Board decided. Council member Brantley stated that she understood where Council member Walsh was coming from. She thought they needed to look at who should be really held responsible and not hold the citizen responsible that offers to serve the city. She said she would vote in support of the appointment.

Council member Brannelly stated that she also understood Council member Walsh's concern, however, she felt that it was important to move forward within the committee to be more aware of what is happening in the city.

Council member Baker questioned if the blame should be on the administration or the committee. He felt that since the matter went through the Ethics Commission, he emphasized that it may be important to step back and research the issue further. He said he would vote to approve the appointment, because there were too many concerns at hand. He urged his colleagues to reconsider their before approving the item.

Council member Walsh stated that the appointment had been the Ethics Commission for four years. City Attorney Anastasi addressed Council member Walsh's comment to say that it was known there was a vacant position that was filled for an unexpired portion of the term that ends 12/31/2010.

Council member Silva stated that during the committee meeting, he wasn't in favor of the appointment. This was due to the process of the appointment that was put forth. He felt the decision of the appointment will hold a lot of power and he thought the process in this case was broken and it needs to be fixed. He stressed that the council should show that they have some power when it comes to appointments or reappointments, because the people in the city rely on them to assure what's done is in their best interest. He stated that he was not in support of approving the item and with the legal matters still in process; he thought the appointment should be delayed.

Council member Martinez stated that she would vote in favor of the appointment for varied reasons; such as the shortage of commissioners to serve on that board.

Council member Taylor-Moye stated that she would vote in favor of the appointment. She didn't feel they should delay the vote in favor, because of an oversight by the administration or process. She strongly felt that since the appointee has sat on the commission for four years, she shouldn't be penalized because of an oversight.

Council member Lyons asked about the six-months expiration term on 12/31/2010; she wanted to know if a person that serves on a committee would be up for reappointment at that time. City Attorney Anastasi said the charter does state that an appointee serves until a successor qualifies. He said he expects they will be able to get appointees in a timely manner.

Council member T. McCarthy stated that the appointee was a good hard working, decent person. He didn't feel that they should make her responsible for any mistake made by the administration. He strongly recommended approval of the appointment.

Council member Holloway stated that they never voted to waive referral to committee in the past. He questioned why they were doing it tonight. Council member Curwen stated that the added item already went through committee anyway.

City Attorney Anastasi disagreed that they never waived referral to committee. He said it had been done before on occasion. He noted that there is a charter requirement to make a second vote for the waiver, unless they elected not to by a two-thirds vote to add it to the agenda.

Council member Baker stated that item **Proposed amendment to the Municipal Code of Ordinances, amend to add new Chapter 8.97 South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone (80-09)** went through committee, but it didn't make the agenda in time.

Council member Brannelly updated that a previous request was made to submit paperwork for items to all council members beforehand, so that they can make an informed vote. Council member T. McCarthy acknowledged the comment and responded that the item already went through committee.

Council member Curwen asked if the item was time sensitive. Council member Baker said no, it was just a matter of not being added to the agenda in time.

Proposed amendments to the Municipal Code of Ordinances amend Chapter 15.44 Flood Damage Prevention (65-09) Council member Baker stated that the item went before the committee, but no one was in attendance to speak on it, so it was tabled. The item pertained to an amendment for flood damage prevention and the FEMA requirement requested. There was a special committee meeting and a public hearing. He noted that it was a time sensitive item.

Council member Brannelly asked if there were any details related to the commitment to be in compliance.

John Urquidi stated the FEMA decides where the flood zone is. And the lending institution requires that they obtain insurance. He clarified that if the item didn't pass they may forfeit the funding.

Council member Baker stated that the document should be submitted in the proper form to the city attorney.

He explained that the item pertained to general obligation bonds. He said it passed in committee, but it missed the deadline to be added to the agenda.

Charles Fereira stipulation amount requested \$35,000.

Mr. Fereira is a retired fire fighter who sustained various traumatic injuries during the course of his employment with the City of Bridgeport.

The claimant's total disability rate is approximately \$900.00 a week, so any period of total disability represents significant exposure to the City of Bridgeport. Disability alone is in the range of \$60,000 to \$75,000; this is without future medical exposure.

Due to the exposure on this file, our defense council, Berkley Administrators, and City Attorney Mark Anastasi feel it is in the City's best interest to settle all claims made against the City of Bridgeport.

Attached is a draft stipulation for a full and final settlement on Mr. Charles Fereira's various workers compensation claims. The stipulation agreement would be payable over two fiscal years. The first payment of \$17,500.00 is to be paid within 20 days of the approval of the stipulation and the remainder to be paid between July 1, 2010 and July 31, 2010.

AWARD BY STIPULATION FOR FULL AND FINAL SETTLEMENT

Upon the within and foregoing Agreement being this day submitted to and examined by the Undersigned, I find the same is a just and reasonable settlement of a disputed claim and ought in all respects to be ratified and confirmed.

WHEREUPON, IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND AWARDED that compliance with this Agreement shall constitute a full, final and complete settlement of a disputed claim which is hereby ratified and confirmed.

AWARD BY STIPULATION FOR FULL AND FINAL SETTLEMENT

On or about May 10, 1982, March 23, 1984, June 25, 1985, June 7, 1986 and for the entire duration of his employment with the employer-respondent, Charles Fereira, hereinafter referred to as the claimant, was employed by the City of Bridgeport Fire Department, hereinafter referred to as the employer-respondent.

Both parties were subject to the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act of the State of Connecticut and the employer had fully complied with the terms thereof by self-insuring its compensation liability with Berkley Risk Administrators of Connecticut, Inc., acting as the Third Party Administrator-Respondent.

Upon due and regular statutory notice, this case was assigned to the Fourth District Commissioner, where representatives of the parties appeared before said Commissioner and with whose assistance have resolved the issues by a full and final settlement.

It is claimant's contention that on or about May 10, 1982, while at work for the employer-respondent, he injured his back and left knee; that on or about March 23, 1984, while at work for the employer-respondent, he injured his back; that on or about June 25, 1985, while at work for the employer-respondent, he injured his right shoulder; that on or about June 7, 1986, while at work for the employer-respondent, he injured his right ankle; that as a result of these accidents, or as a result of repetitive acts, he sustained numerous injuries and conditions, including but not limited to the following: herniated disc at L5-S1; L5 radiculopathy; left sided paraspinous tenderness; paraspinal hypertonicity with point tenderness at the right distal lumbar spine and right sciatic notch; discogenic pain; myospasm, pain, stiffness and discomfort of the low back; restrictive range of motion of the lumbar spine; antalgia; bilateral buttock, leg, thigh and knee pain; osteoarthritis of the left knee; left knee meniscus tears; chondromalacia patella; proximal plantar fasciitis of the left foot; proximal tibial and medial femoral condyle osteophytes; numbness of bilateral feet; right shoulder strain/sprain and/or rotator cuff injury.

The claimant further contends that as a result of said injuries he suffers from a 20% permanent partial disability to the back, 20% permanent partial disability to the left leg, and a significant/substantial permanent partial disability to the right leg and right

shoulder; that the permanent disabilities may increase in the future; that he has required medical, surgical and hospital treatment and may in the future require further medical, surgical and hospital treatment; that he has attempted to work at his former job, but is unable to do that type of work; that he has been disabled totally and partially and may in the future incur such disability.

Alleging that said injuries arose out of and in the course of his employment, the claimant sought compensation for his disabilities past, present and future, both total and partial, compensation for permanent injury and specific compensation, and payment of all reasonable medical, surgical, hospital and incidental bills incurred or to be incurred in connection with the treatment of his condition.

The respondents admit only the injuries of May 10, 1982, March 23, 1984, June 25, 1985, and June 7, 1986, but contend that no permanent injury resulted, other than that accepted via voluntary agreement, if any, contend that the claimant's present trouble is due to causes other than his employment with the employer-respondent; deny that the claimant is now suffering or will in the future suffer any disability either total or partial; deny that the claimant will in the future require further medical, surgical or hospital care as a result of these injuries and deny that the claimant has suffered any permanent partial disability as a result of these injuries, but if any, deny the extent as alleged by the claimant.

However, in view of the number of technical, legal and medical questions which are involved, and in view of the other doubts in the case as outlined by the claims of the parties hereto, it is hereby agreed and understood by and between the claimant, the employer-respondent and the insurer-respondent, all parties to the controversy, that while their respective claims are made in good faith, the claim is a disputed one and that its results, if fully prosecuted, would be doubtful.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed that the respondents shall pay to the claimant the sum of THIRTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$35,000.00), to be split evenly into two sums:

SEVENTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$17,500.00) to be paid within 20 days of the approval of this stipulation;

SEVENTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$17,500.00) to be paid between July 1, 2010 and July 31, 2010.

The same to be in full, final and complete settlement, adjustment, accord and satisfaction of all claims which the aforesaid claimant might otherwise have against the respondents or either of them, known or unknown, and to be made and accepted in lieu of all other compensation payments in accordance with the language of our Compensation Act. The claimant agrees to pay and assume responsibility for all medical, surgical, hospital, nursing and incidental expenses, past, present and future.

The payment as stated above shall be made and accepted as a full and final settlement for all compensation including specific for said injuries, disfigurement for said injuries, scarring for said injuries, and for all results upon the claimant, past, present and future, and for all claims for medical, surgical, hospital and incidental expenses and for all compensation which may be due to anyone in case of the death of the claimant; to the end that the payment of such sum shall constitute a complete satisfaction of all claims due or to become due at any time in favor of anybody on account of the claimed injuries or on account of any condition, known or unknown, in any way resulting out of the said injuries or on account of the claim.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the payment of such sum is in full accord and satisfaction of disputed claims and is not an admission of any liability by the respondents.

It is further stipulated and agreed that before the claimant signed the stipulation he read it or the same was read and interpreted to him in a language that he understood; that he knew that this is a full and final settlement intended to deal with any and all conditions, known or unknown, which exist as of the date hereof, and any changes of conditions which may arise in the future on account of said alleged accidents or injuries.

It is agreed by and between the parties hereto that this stipulation was not induced nor entered into by fraud, accident, mistake or duress and that none of the parties hereafter shall have any further claims under the Workers' Compensation Act of the State of Connecticut; except such rights granted by said Act under Sections 31-293, 31-349, 31-299b and any amendments thereto or any other common law

apportionment remedies are fully reserved.

IN VIEW OF THE FOREGOING, We the undersigned, hereby unite in requesting the Compensation Commissioner for the 4th District to make an award by stipulation pursuant to this Agreement.

Attached, please find a request to initiate a budget transfer to the Fiscal Year 2009-10 General Fund Budget. After the City Council concluded the City's budget process, the State legislature approved the Education Cost Sharing (ECS) funds for education and use of Federal ARRA funds. In order to comply with the Minimum Budget Requirement (MBR), it is necessary to increase the appropriation for the Board of Education and reduce the BOE dedicated use account. The MBR statute has been finalized whereby \$123,109 must be appropriated to the BOE to remain in compliance and not be penalized in FY 2010-11 on a two for one basis. I am recommending the budget transfer to be as follows: Increase line item 01801000 51000 Classroom Teacher Salaries \$123,109 and Decrease the Board of Education Dedicated Use line item 01920000 54580 \$123,109. OPM recognizes the need for this transfer.

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THIS AGREEMENT, effective July 1, 2010 (the “**Effective Date**”) is by and between Bridgeport City & BOE (“**Employer**”) and Connecticut General Life Insurance Company (“**Connecticut General**”).

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, Employer, as plan sponsor, has adopted the benefit described in Exhibit A, as may be amended, (“**Plan**”) for certain of its employees/members and their eligible dependents (collectively “**Members**”); and

WHEREAS, Employer has requested Connecticut General to furnish certain administration services in connection with the Plan described in Exhibit B (Account No. 3213172).

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, it is hereby agreed as follows:

Section 1. Term and Termination of Agreement

This Agreement is effective on the Effective Date cited above. The initial term of this Agreement shall be for thirty-six (36) months commencing on the Effective Date. Thereafter, this Agreement shall renew on each anniversary of the Effective Date (the “anniversary”) for successive terms of twelve (12) month, subject to Connecticut General’s right to revise charges as outlined in Section 8, unless, at least ninety (90) days prior to the end of the then current term the Employer, or at least one hundred eighty (180) days prior to the end of the then current term Connecticut General, gives written notice to the other party that it will not renew the Agreement, (unless the Agreement is otherwise terminated as provided for in Section 1.iv. immediately below). The Agreement shall remain in effect until the earliest of the following dates:

- i. The end of the term in which delivery of written notice of non-renewal is made pursuant to the paragraph above.
- ii. The date which is at least ninety (90) days from the date that Employer or the date which is at least one hundred eighty (180) days form the date that Connecticut General provides written notice to the other party of termination of the Agreement;
- iii. The effective date of any applicable law or governmental action which prohibits

performance of the activities required by this Agreement;

- iv. Two (2) business days from The date upon which Employer fails to fund the Bank Account as required by this Agreement provided Connecticut General notifies Employer of its election to terminate;
- v. Twenty (20) days from the date on which Employer fails to pay Connecticut General any charges identified in this Agreement when due provided Connecticut General notifies Employer of its election to terminate;
- vi. Any other date mutually agreed upon by the Parties.

Section 2. Claim Administration and Additional Services

- a. While this Agreement is in effect, Connecticut General shall, consistent with, the claim administration policies and procedures then applicable to its own health care insurance business and in accordance with all applicable laws (i) receive and review claims for Plan Benefits; (ii) determine the Plan Benefits, if any, payable applicable for such claims; (iii) disburse payments of Plan Benefits to claimants; and (iv) provide in the manner and within the time limits required by applicable law, notification to claimants of (a) the coverage determination or (b) any anticipated delay in

making a coverage determination beyond the time required by applicable law together with an explanation for the delay.

- b. Following (i) termination of this Agreement, except pursuant to Section 1.iii. or (ii) termination of eligibility of a Member, if the required run-out fees have been paid in full, Connecticut General shall process Run-Out Claims for the applicable Run-Out Period (See Schedule of Financial Charges for applicable fees and Run-Out Period). At the termination of any applicable Run-Out Period, Connecticut General shall cease processing Run-Out Claims and make all relevant records in its possession relating to such claims reasonably available to Employer or Employer's designee in Bridgeport, CT. Connecticut General is not required to provide proprietary information to Employer or any other party.
- c. Employer hereby delegates to Connecticut General the authority, responsibility and discretion to (i) determine eligibility and enrollment for coverage under the Plan according to the information provided by Employer, (ii) make factual determinations and to interpret the provisions of the Plan to make coverage determinations on claims for Plan Benefits, (iii) conduct a full and fair review of each claim which has been denied as required by ERISA, (iv) decide level one mandatory appeals of "Urgent Care Claims" (as that term is defined in ERISA), and (v) conduct both mandatory levels of appeal determinations for all "Concurrent", "Pre-service" and "Post-service" claims (as those terms are defined under ERISA) and notify the Member or the Member's authorized representative of its decision. Employer will ensure that all summary plan description materials provided to Members reflect this delegation.
- d. In addition to the basic claim administrative duties described above, Connecticut General shall also perform the Plan-related administrative duties agreed upon by the Parties and specified in Exhibit B.

Section 3. Funding and Payment of Claims

- a. Employer shall establish a Bank Account, and maintain in the Bank Account an amount sufficient at all times to fund checks written on it for (i) Plan Benefits and (ii) those charges and fees identified in the Schedule of Financial Charges as payable through the Bank Account (collectively "Bank Account Payments") (iii) any sales or use taxes, or any similar benefit- or plan-related charge or assessment however denominated, which may be imposed by any governmental authority. Bank Account Payments may include without limitation: (i) capitated (i.e. fixed per Member) payments to Participating Providers; (ii) amounts owed to Connecticut General; (iii) and amounts paid to Connecticut General's affiliates and/or subcontractors for, among other things, network access or in- and out-of network health care services/products provided to Members. Connecticut General may credit the Bank Account with payments due Employer under its or an affiliate's stop loss policy, if applicable.
- b. Connecticut General, as agent for the Employer, shall make Bank Account Payments from the Bank Account in the amount Connecticut General reasonably determines to be proper under the Plan and/or under this Agreement.
- c. In the event that sufficient funds are not available in the Bank Account to pay all Bank Account Payments when due, Connecticut General shall notify Employer immediately and cease to process claims for Plan Benefits including Run-Out claims, until the Employer provides sufficient funds or Connecticut General has terminated the Agreement pursuant to Section 1..
- d. Connecticut General will promptly adjust any underpayment of Plan Benefits by drawing additional funds due the claimant from the Bank Account. In the event Connecticut General overpays a claim for

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Plan Benefits or pays Plan Benefits to the wrong party, it shall take all reasonable steps to recover the overpayment; however, Connecticut General shall not be required to initiate court, mediation, arbitration or other administrative proceedings to recover any overpayment. Connecticut General shall not be responsible for reimbursing any unrecovered payments of Plan Benefits unless made as a result of its gross negligence or intentional wrongdoing.

- e. Except as otherwise provided herein, following termination of this Agreement, Employer shall remain liable for payment of Plan benefits or fees due any provider or entity for services rendered prior to termination. Employer shall reimburse Connecticut General to the extent Connecticut General makes any payment consistent with the plan.

This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement.

Section 4. Charges

- a. Charges. Connecticut General shall provide to Employer a monthly statement of all charges Employer is obligated to pay under this Agreement that are not paid as Bank Account Payments. Payment of all billed charges shall be due on the first day of the month, as indicated on the monthly statement. Payments received after the last day of the month in which they are due, shall be subject to late payment charges, from the due date at a rate calculated as follows: the one (1) year Treasury constant maturities rate for the first week ending in January plus five percent (5%). For purposes of calculating late payment charges, payments received will be applied first to the oldest outstanding amount due. Connecticut General may reasonably revise the methodology for calculating late payment charges upon thirty (30) days' advance written notice to Employer.

- b. Member Changes – Additions and Terminations. If an employee becomes a Member on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the month, full charges applicable to that Member shall be due for that Member for that month. If coverage does not start or ceases on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the month for a Member, no charges shall be due for that Member for that month.
- c. Retroactive Member Changes and Terminations. Employer shall remain responsible for all charges and Bank Account Payments incurred or charged through the date Connecticut General processes Employer's notice of a retroactive change or termination of Membership. However, if the change or termination would result in a reduction in charges, Connecticut General shall credit to Employer the reduction in charges charged for the shorter of (a) the sixty (60) day period preceding the date Connecticut General processes the notice, or (b) the period from the date of the change or termination to the date Connecticut General processes the notice. Connecticut General shall process Employer's notice within five (5) business days of receipt.

This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement.

Section 5. Enrollment and Determination of Eligibility

- a. Eligibility Determinations and Information. Employer is responsible for administering Plan enrollment. In determining any person's right to benefits under the Plan, Connecticut General shall rely upon enrollment and eligibility information furnished by the Employer. Such information shall identify the effective date of eligibility and the termination date of eligibility and shall be provided promptly to Connecticut General in a form and with such other information as reasonably may be required by Connecticut General for the proper administration of the Plan.

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- b. Release of Liability. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of this Agreement to the contrary, if Employer, or its designee, fails to provide Connecticut General with accurate enrollment and eligibility information, benefit design requirements, or other agreed-upon information in Connecticut General's standard timeframe and format, Connecticut General shall have no liability under this Agreement for any act or omission by Connecticut General, or its employees, affiliates, subcontractors, agents or representatives, directly or indirectly caused by such failure.
- c. Reconciliation of Eligibility and Information and Default Terminations. Connecticut General will periodically share potential discrepancies in eligibility information with Employer. Employer will review and reconcile any discrepancies within thirty (30) days of receipt. If Employer fails to timely do so, Connecticut General may terminate coverage for any Member not listed as eligible in Employer's submitted eligibility information.

Section 6. Claim Audits and Confidentiality

- a. Employer may, in accordance with the following requirements and at no additional charge while this Agreement is in effect, audit Connecticut General's payment of Plan Benefits:
- i. Employer shall provide Connecticut General 45 days advance written request for audit. Employer and Connecticut General will agree on an independent, third party auditor to conduct the audit (the "Auditor") and the date for the audit during regular business hours at Connecticut General's office(s). Employer shall be responsible for its Auditor's costs. The audit shall be conducted once the terms of a claim audit agreement are mutually agreed to by the Parties and such agreement shall be

signed by the Auditor prior to the start of the audit.

- ii. If Employer has 5,000 or more employee Members, Employer may conduct one such audit every Plan Year (but not within 6 months of a prior audit); otherwise, Employer may conduct one such audit every two Plan Years (but not within 18 months of a prior audit).
- iii. Auditor will review payment documents relating to a random, statistically valid sample of 225 claims paid during the two prior Plan years and not previously audited (the "Audit") subject to any contrary terms in participating Provider agreements. Connecticut General will reasonably cooperate with audits other than the "Audit" subject to mutually agreed charges. With respect to the audits other than the "Audit", the scope may include types of claims prone to overpayments provided the types of claims prone to underpayments are equally included. With respect to the Audit and any other audit, any claim adjustments will be based upon the actual claims reviewed and not upon statistical projections or extrapolations.
- b. Subject to the requirements of applicable law, the terms of this Agreement and the Privacy Addendum in Exhibit D, a signed Business Associate agreement between Employer and designee, and a signed Confidentiality Agreement by applicable designee, Connecticut General shall release copies of confidential claims and Plan Benefit payment information in Connecticut General's claims system ("**Confidential Information**") and may release copies of proprietary information relating to the Plan in Connecticut General's claims system ("**Proprietary Information**") to the Employer and/or its designees. Employer agrees that Employer and its designees will keep Confidential Information and Proprietary Information confidential and

will use Confidential Information and Proprietary Information solely for the purpose of administering the Plan or as otherwise required by law. Employer is solely responsible for the consequences of any use, misuse, or disclosure of Confidential Information provided by Connecticut General pursuant to this paragraph b.

- c. Connecticut General will maintain the confidentiality of all Protected Health Information in its possession in accordance with the Privacy Addendum in Exhibit D and will indemnify Employer against gross negligence and/or gross misconduct. In addition, all Plan data and records received or created by Connecticut General shall be maintained by Connecticut General for at least the same period of time, and in the same manner and subject to the same privacy and confidentiality safeguards, as similar data and records are maintained by Connecticut General in connection with its own insurance business.
- d. Upon termination of this Agreement, Connecticut General shall make information available to the extent administratively feasible and to the extent the Parties negotiate a mutually agreeable charge.

The obligations set forth in this section shall survive termination of the Agreement.

Section 7. Plan Benefit Liability

- a. Employer Liability for Plan Benefits. Employer is responsible for all Plan Benefits including any Plan Benefits paid as a result of any legal action. Employer is responsible for reimbursing Connecticut General, its directors, officers and employees for any reasonable expense incurred (including reasonable attorneys fees) by them in the defense of any action or proceeding involving a claim for Plan Benefits. Connecticut General shall reasonably

cooperate with Employer in its defense of such actions.

If Connecticut General pays a claim for Extra-Contractual Benefits, Employer is responsible for funding the payment and such payments shall not be considered in determining reimbursements or payments under stop loss insurance or in determining any risk-sharing or performance guarantee reimbursements. Employer shall reimburse Connecticut General for any liability or expenses (including reasonable attorneys fees) it may incur in connection with making such payments.

- b. Employer Liability for Plan Related Expenses. Employer shall reimburse Connecticut General for any amounts Connecticut General may be required to pay (i) as state premium tax or any similar Plan-related tax, charge, surcharge or assessment, or (ii) under any unclaimed or abandoned property, or escheat law, with respect to Plan Benefits and any penalties and/or interest thereon.

These reimbursement obligations shall survive termination of this Agreement.

Section 8. Modification of Plan and Administrative Duties and Charges

- a. Connecticut General shall have the right to revise the charges identified in this Agreement (i) on each anniversary of this Agreement, (ii) at any time by giving Employer at least sixty (60) days' prior written notice, but not more frequently than once in a six (6) month period, (iii) upon any modification or amendment of the benefits under the Plan or Connecticut General's administrative duties, (iv) upon any variation of fifteen percent (15%) or more in the number of Members used by Connecticut General to calculate its charges under the Agreement, and/or (v) upon any change in law or regulation that materially impacts Connecticut General's liabilities and/or responsibilities under this Agreement.

- b. Employer shall provide Connecticut General written notice of any modification or amendment to the Plan sufficiently in advance of any such change as to allow Connecticut General to implement the modification or amendment. Employer and Connecticut General shall agree upon the manner and timing of the implementation subject to Connecticut General's system and operational capabilities.
- c. Modification of Connecticut Generals' duties shall be by mutual agreement. The parties shall reflect such modification and any revised charges (if applicable) in a letter agreement which shall become part of this Agreement.

Section 9. Modification of Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the entire contract between the parties regarding the subject matter herein. Except as otherwise provided herein, the provisions of this Agreement shall control in the event of a conflict with the terms of any other agreements. No modification or amendment hereto shall be valid unless in writing and signed by an authorized person of each of the parties, except that modification of fees pursuant to Section 8 above may be made by written notice to Employer by Connecticut General. If Employer pays such revised fees or fails to object to such revision in writing within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Agreement shall be deemed modified to reflect the fees as communicated by Connecticut General.

Section 10. Laws Governing Contract

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Connecticut without regard to conflict of law rules, and both parties consent to the venue and jurisdiction of its courts in Fairfield County.

Section 11. Information in Connecticut General's Processing Systems

Connecticut General may retain and use all Plan related claim and Plan Benefit payment information recorded for or otherwise integrated into Connecticut General's business records including claim processing systems during the

ordinary course of business (provided, however, that claim or payment information will be available to Employer pursuant to Section 6). Connecticut General will retain claim and payment information as required by applicable law.

Section 12. Resolution of Disputes

Any dispute between the Parties arising from or relating to the performance or interpretation of this Agreement ("**Controversy**") shall be resolved exclusively pursuant to the following mandatory dispute resolution procedures:

- a. Any Controversy shall first be referred to an executive level employee of each party who shall meet and confer with his/her counterpart to attempt to resolve the dispute ("**Executive Review**") as follows: The disputing Party shall give the other Party written notice of the Controversy and request Executive Review. Within twenty (20) days of such written request, the receiving Party shall respond to the other in writing. The notice and the response shall each include a summary of and support for the Party's position. Within thirty (30) days of the request for Executive Review, an employee of each Party, with full authority to resolve the dispute, shall meet and attempt to resolve the dispute.
- b. If the Controversy has not been resolved within thirty-five (35) calendar days of the request of Executive Review under Section 12.a, above, the Parties agree to mediate the Controversy in accordance with the following procedure ("**Mediation**"). The mediation shall be conducted in Bridgeport, Connecticut in front of a neutral panel of three (3) people; one of which shall be selected by the Employer, one of which shall be selected by Connecticut General, and one of which shall be selected by mutual agreement of the parties. Each party shall assume its own costs and attorneys fees. The mediator's compensation and expenses and any administrative fees or costs associated

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with the mediation proceeding shall be borne equally by the parties.

This provision shall survive termination of this Agreement.

Section 13. Third Party Beneficiaries

This Agreement is solely for the benefit of Employer and Connecticut General. It shall not be construed to create any legal relationship between Connecticut General and any other party.

Section 14. Waivers

No course of dealing or failure of either Party to strictly enforce any term, right or condition of this Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of such term, right or condition. Waiver by either Party of any default shall not be deemed a waiver of any other default.

Section 15. Headings

Article, section, or paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.

Section 16. Severability

If any provision or any part of a provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other portion of this Agreement.

Section 17. Force Majeure

Neither party shall be liable for any failure to meet any of the obligations required under this Agreement where such failure to perform is due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of such party, its employees, officers, or directors. Such causes include acts of God, fires, wars, accidents, acts of terrorism, labor disputes or shortages, and governmental laws, ordinances, rules or regulations.

Section 18. Assignment and Subcontracting

Neither Party may assign any right, interest, or obligation hereunder without the express written consent of the other Party; provided, however that Connecticut General may assign any right, interest, or responsibility under this Agreement to its affiliates and/or subcontract specific obligations under the Agreement provided that Connecticut General shall not be relieved of its obligations under the Agreement when doing so.

Section 19. Notices

Except as otherwise provided, all notices or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly made when (a) delivered in person, (b) delivered to an agent, such as an overnight or similar delivery service, or (c) deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:

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Section 20. Identifying Information and Internet Usage

Except as necessary in the performance of their duties under this Agreement, neither party may use the other's name, logo, service marks, trademarks or other identifying information or to establish a link to the other's World Wide Web site without its prior written approval.

Section 21. Insurance

Connecticut General agrees to secure and maintain, at its own cost and expense, those insurances as set forth in Exhibit F attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 22. Definitions

Agreement – this entire document including the Schedule of Financial Charges and all Exhibits.

Bank Account – a benefit plan account with a bank designated by Connecticut General. Established and maintained by Employer in its or a nominee's name.

ERISA – the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended and related regulations.

Extra-Contractual Benefits – Payments which Employer has instructed Connecticut General to make for health care services and/or products that Connecticut General has determined are not covered under the Plan.

Member – a person eligible for and enrolled in the Plan as an employee or dependent.

Participant/Participating Members – Member(s) who is (are) participating in a specific program and/or product available to Members under the Plan.

Participating Providers – providers of health care services and/or products who/which contract directly or indirectly with Connecticut

General to provide services and/or products to Members.

Plan Benefits – Amounts payable for covered health care services and products under the terms of the Plan.

Party/Parties – refers to Employer and Connecticut General, each a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties."

Plan Year – the 12 month period beginning on the July 1 and ending on June 30 of the following year.

Run-Out Claims – claims for Plan Benefits relating to health care services and products that are incurred prior to termination of this Agreement or termination of a Plan benefit option, as applicable.

Section 23. Order of Precedence

The parties agree that in the event of a dispute or disagreement on interpretation of the terms of this Agreement, the parties will look to the following documents in the following order for clarification purposes:

- A. ASO Agreement
- B. Performance Guarantee Agreements
- C. RFQ/RFP Responses dated November 4, 2009

Exhibit C – Claim Audit Agreement (Sample)

- A. WHEREAS, Connecticut General Life Insurance Company ("Connecticut General") desires to cooperate with requests by _____ (" A Employer") to permit an audit for the purposes set forth below; and
- B. WHEREAS, _____ ("the Auditor") has been retained by Employer for the purpose of performing an audit ("Audit") of claims administered by Connecticut General.
- C. WHEREAS, the Auditor and the Employer recognize Connecticut General's legitimate interests in maintaining the confidentiality of its claim information, protecting its business reputation, avoiding unnecessary disruption of its claim administration;

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the premises and the mutual promises contained herein, Connecticut General, the Employer and the Auditor hereby agree as follows:

1. Audit Specifications

The Auditor will specify to Connecticut General in writing at least forty-five (45) days prior to the commencement of the Audit the following "Audit Specifications":

- a. the name, title and professional qualifications of individual Auditors;
- b. the Claim Office locations, if any, to be audited;
- c. the Audit objectives;
- d. the scope of the Audit (time period, lines of coverage and number of claims);
- e. the process by which claims will be selected for audit;
- f. the records/information required by the Auditor for purposes of the Audit; and
- g. the length of time contemplated as necessary to complete the Audit.

2. Review of Specifications

Connecticut General will have the right to review the Audit Specifications and to require any changes in, or conditions on, the Audit Specifications which may be necessary to protect Connecticut General's legal and business interests identified in paragraph C above except that such audit may not be limited by Connecticut General for purposes of shielding it from legal liability.

3. Access to Information

Connecticut General will make the records/information called for in the Audit Specifications available to the Auditor at a mutually acceptable time and place.

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4. Audit Report

The Auditor will provide Connecticut General with a true copy of the Audit's findings, as well as of the Audit Report, if any, that is submitted to the Employer. Such copies will be provided to Connecticut General at the same time that the Audit findings and the Audit Report are submitted to the Employer.

5. Comment on Audit Report

Connecticut General reserves the right to provide the Auditor and the Employer with its comments on the findings and, if applicable, the Audit Report.

6. Confidentiality

The Auditor understands that Connecticut General is permitting the Auditor to review the claim records/information solely for purposes of the Audit. Accordingly, the Auditor will ensure that all information pertaining to individual claimants will be kept confidential in accordance with all applicable laws and/or regulations. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Auditor specifically agrees to adhere to the following conditions:

- a. The Auditor shall not make photocopies or remove any of the claim records/information without the express written consent of Connecticut General;
- b. The Auditor agrees that its Audit Report or any other summary prepared in connection with the Audit shall contain no individually identifiable information.

7. Restricted Use of the Audit Information

With respect to persons other than the Employer, the Auditor will hold and treat information obtained from Connecticut General during the Audit with the same degree and standard of confidentiality owed by the Auditor to its clients in accordance with all applicable legal and professional standards. The Auditor shall not, without the express written consent of Connecticut General executed by an officer of Connecticut General, disclose in any manner whatsoever, the results, conclusions, reports or information of whatever nature which it acquires or prepares in connection with the Audit to any party other than the Employer except as required or permitted by applicable law. The Employer and Auditor agree to indemnify and to hold harmless Connecticut General for any and all claims, costs, expenses and damages which may result from any breaches of the Auditor's obligations under paragraphs 6 and 7 of this Agreement or from Connecticut General's provision of information to the Auditor. The Employer authorizes Connecticut General to provide to the designated Auditor the necessary information to perform the audit in a manner consistent with all Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("HIPAA"), Privacy Standards and in compliance with the signed Business Associate Agreement ("BAA").

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8. Termination

Connecticut General may terminate this agreement with prior written notice. The obligations set forth in Sections 4 through 7 shall survive termination of the Agreement.

Exhibit D – Privacy Addendum

(“Business Associate Agreement”)

I. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. Effect. As of the Effective Date, the terms and provisions of this Addendum are incorporated in and shall supersede any conflicting or inconsistent terms and provisions of (as applicable) the Administrative Services Only Agreement and/or Flexible Spending Account or Reimbursement Accounts Administrative Services Agreement to which this Addendum is attached, including all exhibits or other attachments to and all documents incorporated by reference in any such applicable agreements (individually and collectively any such applicable agreements are referred to as the “**Agreement**”). This Addendum sets out terms and provisions relating to the use and disclosure of protected health information without written authorization from the Individual.

Section 2. Amendment to Comply with Law. Connecticut General, Employer (also referred to as “**Plan Sponsor**”) and the group health plan that is the subject of the Agreement (also referred to as the “**Plan**”) agree to amend this Addendum to the extent necessary to allow either the Plan or Connecticut General to comply with the HIPAA Privacy Rule, the HIPAA Standards for Electronic Transactions (45 CFR Parts 160 and 162), the HIPAA Security Standards (45 CFR Parts 160 and 164, Subpart C), the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (“**HITECH**”) Act, which was included in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (“**ARRA**”) (P.L. 111-5) and their implementing regulations promulgated or to be promulgated by the Secretary, and other applicable regulations or statutes.

Section 3. Definitions. Certain capitalized terms used in this Addendum are defined in Article V. Terms used in this Addendum shall have the meanings ascribed to them by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (“**HIPAA**”) and the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (“**HITECH**”) Act and their respective implementing regulations and guidance. If the meaning of any term defined herein is changed by regulatory or legislative amendment, then this Agreement will be modified automatically to correspond to the amended definition. All capitalized terms used herein that are not otherwise defined have the meanings described in the HIPAA Privacy and Security Rules and the HITECH Act. A reference in this Addendum to a section in the HIPAA Privacy Rule, HIPAA Security Rule, or the HITECH Act means the section as it may be amended or substituted in the future.

II. OBLIGATIONS OF CONNECTICUT GENERAL

Section 1. Use and Disclosure of PHI. Connecticut General may use and disclose Protected Health Information (“**PHI**”) only if such use or disclosure is in compliance with the applicable requirements of 45 CFR § 164.504(e), is required to satisfy its obligations or is permitted under the Agreement, and/or is permitted or required by law, but shall not otherwise use or disclose any PHI. Connecticut General shall not use or disclose, and shall ensure that its directors, officers and employees do not use or disclose, PHI in any manner that would constitute a violation of the Privacy Rule if done by the Plan, except that Connecticut General may use and disclose PHI as permitted under the Privacy Rule (i) for the proper management and administration of Connecticut General, (ii) to carry out the legal responsibilities of Connecticut General or (iii) to provide Data Aggregation services relating to the health care operations of the Plan if such services are required under the Agreement.

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Section 2. Receiving Remuneration in Exchange for Protected Health Information Prohibited. Effective for exchanges occurring on or after the date that is six (6) months after the date of the promulgation of final regulations by the Secretary implementing Section 13405(d) of HITECH, Connecticut General shall not directly or indirectly receive remuneration in exchange for any Protected Health Information of an Individual, unless the Plan obtained from the Individual, in accordance with 45 CFR § 164.508, a valid authorization that, in accordance with such section, specifies whether the Protected Health Information can be further exchanged for remuneration by the entity receiving Protected Health Information of that Individual, unless the purpose of the exchange is:

- (A) For public health activities (as described in 45 CFR § 164.512(b));
- (B) For research (as described in 45 CFR §§ 164.501 and 164.512(i)) and the price charged reflects the costs of preparation and transmittal of the data for such purpose;
- (C) For the treatment of the Individual, subject to any regulations preventing Protected Health Information from inappropriate access, use, or disclosure;
- (D) The health care operation specifically described in subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (6) of the definition of health care operations in 45 CFR § 164.501;
- (E) For remuneration provided by the Plan to Connecticut General for activities involving the exchange of Protected Health Information Connecticut General undertakes on behalf of and at the request of the Plan pursuant to the Agreement;
- (F) To provide an Individual with a copy of his or her Protected Health Information pursuant to 45 CFR § 164.524; or
- (G) Otherwise determined by regulations of the Secretary to be similarly necessary and appropriate as the exceptions described in (a) through (f) above.

Section 3. Limited Data Set or Minimum Necessary Standard and Determination. Effective on and after February 17, 2010, Connecticut General shall limit the use, disclosure, or request of Individuals' Protected Health Information, to the extent practicable, to the Limited Data Set (as defined in 45 CFR § 164.514(e)(2)) or, if needed by Connecticut General, to the minimum necessary amount of Individuals' Protected Health Information to accomplish the intended purpose of such use, disclosure, or request and to perform its obligations under the underlying Agreement and this Addendum. Connecticut General shall determine what constitutes the minimum necessary to accomplish the intended purpose of such disclosure. Connecticut General's obligations under this provision shall be subject to modification to comply with guidance issued by the Secretary.

Section 4. Security Standards. Effective on and after February 17, 2010, Business Associate shall comply with the administrative, physical, and technical safeguards and standards set out in 45 CFR §164.308, §164.310, and §164.312, and with the policies and procedures and documentation requirements set out in 45 CFR §164.316.

Section 5. Protection of Electronic PHI. With respect to Electronic Protected Health Information, Connecticut General shall:

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- (A) Implement administrative, physical, and technical safeguards that reasonably and appropriately protect the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of the Electronic Protected Health Information that Connecticut General creates, receives, maintains, or transmits on behalf of the Plan as required by the Security Standards;
- (B) Ensure that any agent, including a subcontractor, to whom Connecticut General provides such information agrees to implement reasonable and appropriate safeguards to protect it; and,
- (C) Report to the Plan any Security Incident of which it becomes aware.

Section 6. Reporting of Violations. Connecticut General shall report to the Plan any use or disclosure of PHI not provided for by this Addendum of which it becomes aware. Connecticut General agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect from a use or disclosure of PHI in violation of this Addendum of which it is aware.

Section 7. Security Breach Notification. Connecticut General will notify the Plan of a Breach without unreasonable delay. This notification will include, to the extent known:

- i. the names of the individuals whose PHI was involved in the Breach;
- ii. the circumstances surrounding the Breach;
- iii. the date of the Breach and the date of its discovery;
- iv. the information Breached;
- v. any steps the impacted individuals should take to protect themselves;
- vi. the steps Connecticut General is taking to investigate the Breach, mitigate losses, and protect against future Breaches; and,
- vii. a contact person who can provide additional information about the Breach.

Connecticut General will perform a fact-based risk assessment, as required by the HITECH Act, to determine whether there is a significant risk of financial, reputational, or other harm to the individual whose PHI was impacted. Connecticut General will provide the Plan with the results of its risk assessment and will make a recommendation to the Plan regarding whether notification is required pursuant to 45 CFR §164.404-408. With the Plan's prior approval, Connecticut General will issue such notices (to individuals, to the Department of Health and Human Services, and to the media) as the Plan is required to issue pursuant to, and in accordance with the requirements of, 45 CFR §164.404-408. Connecticut General will pay the costs of issuing notices required by law and other remediation and mitigation which, in Business Associate's discretion, are appropriate and necessary to address the Breach. Connecticut General will not be required to issue notifications that are not mandated by applicable law. Connecticut General will maintain a log of Breaches and will provide such log to the Plan annually to support the Plan's regulatory reporting obligations.

Section 8. Disclosures to and Agreements by Third Parties. Connecticut General shall ensure that each agent and subcontractor to whom it provides PHI agrees to the same restrictions and conditions with respect to such PHI that apply to Connecticut General pursuant to this Addendum.

Section 9. Access to PHI. Connecticut General shall provide an Individual with access to such Individual's PHI contained in a Designated Record Set in response to such Individual's request in the manner and time required in 45 CFR 164.524.

Section 10. Availability of PHI for Amendment. Connecticut General shall respond to a request by an Individual for amendment to such Individual's PHI contained in a Designated Record Set in the manner and time required in 45 CFR 164.526, except that the Plan shall handle any requests for amendment of PHI originated by the Plan, Plan Sponsor or the Plan's other business associates, such as enrollment information.

Section 11. Modifications to Individual Rights and Accounting of Disclosures. Effective on and after February 17, 2010, or the date specifically provided in the HITECH Act or regulations issued by the Secretary pursuant to the HITECH Act, Connecticut General shall comply with, and shall assist the Plan in complying with, the modifications to the individual rights under the HIPAA Privacy Rule; specifically modifications to: requested restrictions on certain disclosures of health information, under 45 CFR § 164.522(a)(1)(i)(A); access to certain information in electronic format if the Plan or Connecticut General uses or maintains an electronic health record with respect to an Individual's Protected Health Information, under 45 CFR § 164.524; and accounting of certain Protected Health Information disclosures if the Plan or Connecticut General uses or maintains an electronic health record with respect to Protected Health Information, under 45 CFR § 164.528. Connecticut General shall provide an accounting of disclosures of PHI to an Individual who requests such accounting in the manner and time required in 45 CFR 164.528.

Section 12. Requests for Privacy Protection. Connecticut General shall handle requests by an Individual for privacy protection for such Individual's PHI pursuant to the requirements of 45 CFR 164.522.

Section 13. Processes and Procedures. In carrying out its duties set forth in Article II, Sections 6, 7, 8 and 9 above, Connecticut General will implement the Standard Business Associate Processes and Procedures (the "Processes and Procedures") attached hereto for requests from Individuals, including the requirement that requests be made in writing, the creation of forms for use by Individuals in making such requests, and the setting of time periods for the Plan to forward to Connecticut General any such requests made directly to the Plan or Plan Sponsor. In addition, Connecticut General will implement the Processes and Procedures relating to disclosure of PHI to Plan Sponsor or designated third parties.

Section 14. Availability of Books and Records. Connecticut General hereby agrees to make its internal practices, books and records relating to the use and disclosure of PHI available to the Secretary for purposes of determining the Plan's compliance with the Privacy Rule.

III. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT WITH CONNECTICUT GENERAL

Section 1. Termination upon Breach of Provisions Applicable to PHI. Any other provision of the Agreement notwithstanding, the Agreement may be terminated by the Plan upon prior written notice to Connecticut General in the event that Connecticut General materially breaches any obligation of this Addendum and fails to cure the breach within such reasonable time as the Plan may provide for in such notice; provided that in the event that termination of the Agreement is not feasible, in the Plan's sole discretion, the Plan shall have the right to report the breach to the Secretary.

Effective on and after February 17, 2010, if Connecticut General knows of a pattern of activity or practice of the Plan that constitutes a material breach or violation of the Plan's duties and obligations under this Addendum, Connecticut General shall provide a reasonable period of time, as agreed upon by the parties, for the Plan to cure the material breach or violation. Provided, however, that, if the Plan does not cure the material breach or violation within such agreed upon time period, Connecticut General shall terminate the Agreement, if feasible, at the end of such period. However, if neither termination of the Agreement nor cure are feasible, Business Associate shall report the violation to the Secretary.

Section 2. Use of PHI upon Termination. The parties hereto agree that it is not feasible for Connecticut General to return or destroy PHI at termination of the Agreement; therefore, the protections of this Addendum for PHI shall survive termination of the Agreement, and Connecticut General shall limit any further uses and disclosures of such PHI to the purpose or purposes which make the return or destruction of such PHI infeasible.

IV. OBLIGATION OF THE PLAN

The Plan will not request Connecticut General to use or disclose PHI in any manner that would not be permissible under the Privacy Rule if done by the Plan, except as provided in Article II, Section 1, subsections (i) through (iii).

V. DEFINITIONS FOR USE IN THIS ADDENDUM

"Breach" means the unauthorized acquisition, access, use, or disclosure of Unsecured Protected Health Information which compromises the security or privacy of such information, except where an authorized person to whom such information is disclosed would not reasonably have been able to retain such information. A Breach does not include any unintentional acquisition, access, or use of PHI by an employee or individual acting under the authority of Connecticut General if such acquisition, access, or use was made in good faith and within the course and scope of the employment or other professional relationship of such employee or individual with Connecticut General; and such information is not further acquired, accessed, used, or disclosed by any person.

"Designated Record Set" shall have the same meaning as the term "designated record set" as set forth in the Privacy Rule, limited to the enrollment, payment, claims adjudication, and case or medical management record systems maintained by Connecticut General for the Plan, or used, in whole or in part, by Connecticut General or the Plan to make decisions about Individuals.

"Effective Date" shall mean the earliest date by which the Plan is required to have executed a Business Associate Agreement with Connecticut General pursuant to the Privacy Rule.

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"Electronic Protected Health Information" shall mean PHI that is transmitted by or maintained in electronic media as that term is defined in 45 CFR 162.103.

"Limited Data Set" shall have the same meaning as the term "limited data set" as set forth in as defined in 45 CFR 164.514(e)(2).

"Privacy Rule" shall mean the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information, 45 CFR Parts 160 and 164, Subparts A and E.

"Protected Health Information" or **"PHI"** shall have the same meaning as the term "protected health information" as set forth in the Privacy Rule, limited to the information created or received by Connecticut General from or on behalf of the Plan; provided that "Protected Health Information" shall not include (i) education records covered by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, as amended, 20 USC 1232g; (ii) records described in 20 USC 1232g(a)(4)(B)(iv); and (iii) employment records held by the Plan in its role as employer.

"Secretary" shall mean the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

"Security Incident" shall have the same meaning as the term "security incident" as set forth in 45 CFR 164.304.

"Unsecured Protected Health Information" shall mean PHI that is not secured through the use of a technology or methodology specified by the Secretary in accordance with the requirements of Section 13401(h)(1) of the HITECH Act.

**Connecticut General Life Insurance Company
Standard Business Associate Processes and Procedures**

These Standard Business Associate Processes and Procedures apply to each self-funded group health plan ("Plan") of an entity ("Plan Sponsor") that has entered or will enter into an Administrative Services Only Agreement, Flexible Spending Account or Reimbursement Accounts Administrative Services Agreement and/or Continuation Coverage Services Agreement (collectively, as applicable, the "Administrative Services Agreement") with Connecticut General Life Insurance Company ("Connecticut General"). In compliance with 45 CFR 164.502(e) and 164.504(e), the Administrative Services Agreement has been or will be modified by a Privacy Addendum or Business Associate Agreement (either referred to herein as the "Business Associate Agreement") between or among the Plan and/or Plan Sponsor and Connecticut General. Unless otherwise defined, capitalized terms have the meaning provided in the applicable Privacy Addendum or Business Associate Agreement, or if not defined in such agreement, as defined in 45 CFR Parts 160 and 164, Subpart E (the "Privacy Rule").

Section 1. Access to PHI. When an Individual requests access to Protected Health Information (or "PHI") contained in a Designated Record Set and such request is made directly to the Plan or Plan Sponsor, the Plan shall forward the request to Connecticut General within five (5) business days of such receipt. Upon receipt of such request from the Plan, or upon receipt of such a request directly from an Individual, Connecticut General shall make such PHI available directly to the Individual within the time and manner required in 45 CFR 164.524. The Plan delegates to Connecticut General the duty to determine, on behalf of the Plan, whether to deny access to PHI requested by an Individual and the duty to provide any required notices and review in accordance with the Privacy Rule.

Section 2. Availability of PHI for Amendment.

- (a) When an Individual requests amendment to PHI contained in a Designated Record Set, and such request is made directly to the Plan or Plan Sponsor, within five (5) business days of such receipt, the Plan shall forward such request to Connecticut General for handling, except that the Plan shall retain and handle all such requests to the extent that they pertain to Individually Identifiable Health Information (such as enrollment information) originated by the Plan, Plan Sponsor, or the Plan's other business associates. Connecticut General shall respond to such forwarded requests as well as to any such requests that it receives directly from Individuals as required by 45 CFR 164.526, except that Connecticut General shall forward to the Plan for handling any requests for amendment of PHI originated by the Plan, Plan Sponsor, or the Plan's other business associates.
- (b) With respect to those requests handled by Connecticut General under subparagraph (a) above, the Plan delegates to Connecticut General the duty to determine, on behalf of the Plan, whether to deny a request for amendment of PHI and the duty to provide any required notices and review as well as, in the case of its determination to grant such a request, the duty to make any amendments in accordance with the terms of the Privacy Rule. In all other instances, the Plan retains all responsibility for handling such requests, including any denials, in accordance with the Privacy Rule.
- (c) Whenever Connecticut General is notified by the Plan that the Plan has agreed to make an amendment pursuant to a request that it handles under subparagraph (a) above,

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Connecticut General shall incorporate any such amendments in accordance with 45 CFR 164.526.

Section 3. Accounting of Disclosures. When an Individual requests an accounting of disclosures of PHI held by Connecticut General directly to the Plan or Plan Sponsor, the Plan shall within five (5) business days of such receipt forward the request to Connecticut General to handle. Connecticut General shall handle such requests, and any such requests for an accounting of disclosures received directly from Individuals, in the time and manner as required in 45 CFR 164.528.

Section 4. Requests for Privacy Protection. Connecticut General shall handle Individuals' requests made to it for privacy protection for PHI in Connecticut General's possession pursuant to the requirements of 45 CFR 164.522. The Plan shall forward to Connecticut General to handle any such requests the Plan receives from Individuals that affect PHI held by Connecticut General.

Section 5. General Provisions Regarding Requests. Connecticut General may require that requests pursuant to Sections 1 through 4 above be made in writing and may create forms for use by Individuals in making such requests. When responding to an Individual's request as provided above, Connecticut General may inform the Individual that there may be other "protected health information" created or maintained by the Plan and/or the Plan's other business associates and not included in the Connecticut General's response. Connecticut General shall not be responsible for performing any duties described in the Business Associate Agreement with respect to any such other "protected health information." In carrying out its duties set forth herein, Connecticut General may establish such additional procedures and processes for requests from Individuals as permitted by the Privacy Rule.

Section 6. Disclosure of PHI to the Plan Sponsor. To the extent that the fulfillment of Connecticut General's obligations under the Administrative Services Agreement requires Connecticut General to disclose or provide access to PHI to Plan Sponsor or any person under the control of Plan Sponsor (including third parties), Connecticut General shall make such disclosure of or provide such access to PHI only as follows:

- (i) Connecticut General shall disclose Summary Health Information to any employee or other person under the control of Plan Sponsor (including third parties) upon the Plan Sponsor's written request for the purpose of obtaining premium bids for the provision of health insurance or HMO coverage for the Plan or modifying, amending or terminating the Plan; and
- (ii) If the Plan elects to provide PHI to the Plan Sponsor, Connecticut General shall disclose or make available PHI, other than Summary Health Information, at the written direction of the Plan to only those employees or other persons identified in the Plan documents and under the control of Plan Sponsor solely for the purpose of carrying out the Plan administration functions that Plan Sponsor performs for the Plan. Such employees or other persons (including third parties) will be identified by the Plan in writing (by name, title, or other appropriate designation) to Connecticut General as a condition of disclosure of PHI pursuant to this Section 6(ii). The Plan may modify such list from time to time by written notice to Connecticut General.

Section 7. Disclosures of PHI to Third Parties. Upon the Plan's written request, Connecticut General will provide PHI to certain designated third parties who assist in administering the Plan and who are authorized by the Plan to receive such information solely for the purpose of assisting in carrying out Plan administration functions ("Designated Third Parties"). Such parties may include, but are not limited to, third-party administrators, consultants, brokers, auditors, successor administrators or insurers, and stop-

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loss carriers. As a condition to providing PHI to a Designated Third Party, Connecticut General may require that the Plan have a business associate agreement (within the meaning of the Privacy Rule) with such Designated Third Party.

Exhibit E – Conditional Claim/Subrogation Recovery Services

I. Plans Without Connecticut General Stop Loss Coverage

If Employer has not purchased individual or aggregate stop loss coverage from Connecticut General or an affiliate with respect to its self-funded employee welfare benefit plan:

- A. All conditional claim payment and/or subrogation recoveries under the Plan will be handled by the entity checked below;

- B. If Employer has designated Connecticut General and its subcontractors to act as its recovery agent in paragraph I.A. above, then:

i. Employer hereby confers upon Connecticut General and its subcontractors discretionary authority to reduce recovery amounts by as much as twenty-five percent (25%) of the total amount of benefits paid on Employer's behalf, and to enter into binding settlement agreements for such amounts.

ii. In the event a settlement offer represents a reduction greater than the percentage identified above, Connecticut General and its subcontractors should seek settlement advice from:

iii. All amounts reimbursed to Employer's benefit payment account shall be refunded at the gross amount. Connecticut General's and its subcontractors' subrogation administration fee on cases where Connecticut General and its subcontractors' have retained counsel and in cases where no counsel has been retained by Connecticut General and its subcontractors, are both reflected in the Schedule of Financial Charges. For the purposes of such fee calculations, the use of counsel to perform ministerial acts such as filing of appearances or defenses in states which require plaintiffs to name employee benefit plans as party defendants and in similar circumstances shall not constitute the retention of counsel.

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- C. Except where agreed to by Connecticut General and Employer, Connecticut General and its subcontractors shall have no duty or obligation to represent Employer in any litigation or court proceeding involving any matter which is the subject of this Agreement, but shall make available to Employer and/or Employer's counsel such information relevant to such action or proceeding as Connecticut General and its subcontractors may have as a result of its handling of any matter under this Agreement.
- D. In the event Employer purchases individual or aggregate stop loss coverage from Connecticut General or an affiliate with respect to its self-funded employee welfare benefit plan at any time during the life of this Agreement, the provisions of paragraph II., below, shall control.

II. Plans with Connecticut General Stop Loss Coverage

If Employer has purchased individual or aggregate stop loss coverage from Connecticut General or an affiliate with respect to its self-funded employee welfare benefit plan:

- A. Connecticut General and its subcontractors shall have the right and responsibility to manage all conditional claim payment and/or subrogation recoveries under the Plan. Connecticut General and its subcontractors shall reimburse to the Plan the recovery minus relevant individual and aggregate stop loss payments made by Connecticut General.
- B. All amounts reimbursed to Employer's benefit payment account shall be refunded at the gross amount. Connecticut General's and its subcontractors' subrogation administration fee on cases where Connecticut General and its subcontractors' have retained counsel and in cases where no counsel has been retained by Connecticut General and its subcontractors, are both reflected in the Schedule of Financial Charges.
- C. Connecticut General and its subcontractors shall have no duty or obligation to represent Employer in any litigation or court proceeding involving any matter which is the subject of this Agreement but shall make available to Employer and/or Employer's counsel such information relevant to such action or proceeding as Connecticut General and its subcontractors may have as a result of its handling of any matter under this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Connecticut General and its subcontractors reserve to itself the right to retain counsel to represent Connecticut General's own interests in any subrogation and/or conditional claim recovery action under the Plan.

Exhibit F – Insurance Requirements

**ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES ONLY AGREEMENT
BY AND BETWEEN
BRIDGEPORT CITY & BOE
AND
CONNECTICUT GENERAL LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY**

A. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS:

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall be responsible for maintaining insurance coverage in force for the life of this contract of the kinds and adequate amounts to secure all of **CONNECTICUT GENERAL'S** obligations under this contract with an insurance company(ies) with an AM Best Rating of A- VIII or better licensed to write such insurance in the State of Connecticut.

The insurer shall provide the Bridgeport City & BOE with original completed **Certificates of Insurance signed by an authorized representative of the insurance company(ies)** prior to execution of the ASO Agreement. The completed Certificate shall confirm the insurer agrees to give the Bridgeport City & BOE written notice within thirty (30) days of any termination, expiration, or any material changes in coverage.

Such insurance or renewals or replacements thereof shall remain in force during **CONNECTICUT GENERAL'S** responsibility under this contract.

CONNECTICUT GENERAL, at **CONNECTICUT GENERAL'S** own cost and expense, shall procure and maintain all insurances required and shall name the Bridgeport City & BOE as Additional Insured on all contracts, except Workers' Compensation and Professional Liability coverage. Coverage is to be provided on a primary, noncontributory basis.

In order to facilitate this requirement for insurance, it is recommended that CONNECTICUT GENERAL forward a copy of these requirements to CONNECTICUT GENERAL'S insurance representative(s).

B. SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS:

(1) Workers' Compensation Insurance -

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall provide Statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance, including Employer's Liability with limits of:

\$100,000 Each Accident
\$500,000 Disease, Policy Limit
\$100,000 Disease, Each Employee

(2) **Commercial General Liability Insurance -**

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall carry Commercial General Liability insurance (Insurance Services Offices Incorporated Form CG-0001 or equivalent). A per occurrence limit of \$1,000,000 is required. The Aggregate Limit will be not less than \$1,000,000. Any deviations from the standard unendorsed form will be noted on the Certificate of Insurance.

(3) **Business Automobile Liability Insurance -**

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall carry Business Automobile Liability insurance (Insurance Services Office Incorporated Form CA-00001 or equivalent). A combined single limit each accident of \$1,000,000 is required. "Any Auto" (symbol 1 or equivalent) is required. Any deviations from the standard unendorsed form will be noted on the Certificate of Insurance.

(4) **Professional Liability Insurance -**

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall carry Professional Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.

C. SUBCONTRACTORS REQUIREMENTS:

CONNECTICUT GENERAL shall use commercially reasonable efforts to require insurance coverage by any subcontractors and independent contractors hired by **CONNECTICUT GENERAL** pursuant to **CONNECTICUT GENERAL'S** standard policies and procedures for risk management.

CONNECTICUT GENERAL and the Bridgeport City & BOE waive all rights of subrogation against each other for losses arising from work performed by each on this contract.

D. OTHER

If any policy is written on a "claims-made" basis, **CONNECTICUT GENERAL** agrees to maintain adequate insurance coverage for claims for the policy in effect during the contract.

This Performance Guarantee Agreement ("Agreement") is between Connecticut General Life Insurance Company and applicable affiliates (collectively "Connecticut General") and Bridgeport City & BOE ("Employer") and is effective on July 1, 2010 ("Effective Date").

WHEREAS, in connection with certain services and programs that Connecticut General is providing to Employer for certain employee welfare benefit plans sponsored by Employer (the "Plans") under the applicable agreements between the parties (individually or collectively, the "Service Agreements and/or Policies"), Connecticut General and Employer desire to implement certain performance guarantees set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto, according to the terms set forth below.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, Connecticut General and Employer hereby agree as follows:

Section 1. – Term and Termination

1.1. This Agreement is effective on the Effective Date stated above and shall remain in effect for one (1) year or, if applicable, for specific Performance Guarantees, the period of time expressly noted for applicable Performance Guarantees in applicable Exhibit B (the "Term") unless terminated sooner upon the earliest of the following dates:

1.1.1. As to specific Performance Guarantees, the date when Connecticut General ceases to administer the Plan(s) (run-out services notwithstanding) or when the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies are terminated (run-out services notwithstanding) or suspended;

1.1.2. The date when any state or other applicable jurisdiction prohibits the activities of the parties under this Agreement;

1.1.3. The Effective Date, in the event that any condition precedent listed in Section 3 or in applicable Exhibit B as to specific Performance Guarantees, is not satisfied.

1.2. This Agreement is not renewable. However, Connecticut General agrees to issue new, substantially similar, Performance Guarantee Agreements to Employer to be effective for Plan Year 2 and Plan Year 3 of the ASO Agreement entered into between Employer and Connecticut General.

Section 2. – Definitions

2.1. Additional definitions applicable to specific Performance Guarantees are listed in applicable Exhibit B. Terms not defined in this Section, in applicable Exhibit B or otherwise in this Agreement shall be deemed to reflect the common use industry meaning.

2.1.1. **Benefit Profile** - The benefits offered under the Plan(s), including plan design and structure.

2.1.2. **Business Days** - The days of the week that Connecticut General is open to the public for conducting business.

2.1.3. **Employee** - A person who is employed by Employer and covered under the Plan.

2.1.4. **Guarantee Period** - The time frame for which Performance Guarantees will be measured, which shall be one (1) year from the Effective Date of this Agreement, unless expressly noted otherwise in Exhibit A or applicable Exhibit B.

2.1.5. **Maximum Payment Amount** - The maximum amount of Payment Amounts that Connecticut General shall be obligated to pay Employer for specific Performance Guarantees.

2.1.6. **Payment Amount** - The amount payable to Employer, as determined by Connecticut General under the criteria set forth in this Agreement, if Performance Guarantees are not met. For purposes of this definition, "Payment Amount" for Performance Guarantees shall not exceed the Maximum Payment Amounts, if applicable.

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- 2.1.7. Performance Guarantees – The level of performance that Connecticut General commits to achieve under the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies, as set forth in the Exhibit A.
- 2.1.8. Plan Participants – Eligible persons enrolled in the applicable Plan connected to the specific Performance Guarantee.
- 2.1.9. Projected Population – The number of Employees that Employer estimated would be enrolled on the Effective Date. The Projected Population for Employer is 5,495 Medical enrolled Employees.

Section 3. – Conditions Precedent

- 3.1. Employer acknowledges and agrees that the following conditions precedent are required for the Performance Guarantees set forth in this Agreement to be in effect, otherwise the Performance Guarantees set forth in this Agreement are null and void:
 - 3.1.1. This Agreement is signed by both parties within three (3) months of the Effective Date;
 - 3.1.2. Employer does not make a material change in Benefit Profiles during the Term that, as reasonably determined by Connecticut General, affects the performance being measured in the Performance Guarantees;
 - 3.1.3. Connecticut General continuously administers the services on which the applicable Performance Guarantees are based throughout the Term of this Agreement;
 - 3.1.4. Employer must be an active client for the type of coverage to which this Agreement relates (e.g. Medical, Dental, Pharmacy, Vision, etc.) at the time the payment amount is otherwise due under this agreement;
 - 3.1.5. There are at least 200 enrolled Employees as of the Effective Date;
 - 3.1.6. This Agreement remains in effect throughout the Term of this Agreement;

- 3.1.7. The applicable Plan(s) remain in effect throughout the Term of this Agreement;
- 3.1.8. The applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies to which the Performance Guarantee relates remains in effect throughout the Term of this Agreement or the Employer materially performs under the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies throughout the Term of this Agreement;
- 3.1.9. The conditions precedent for specific Performance Guarantees set forth in applicable Exhibit B occur.

Section 4. – Evaluation of Performance and Payment Amounts

- 4.1. Performance Guarantees and the applicable levels of measurement, Payment Amounts and Maximum Payment Amounts are listed in Exhibit A. Any additional terms, conditions precedent and definitions, if applicable, for specific Performance Guarantee, are listed in applicable Exhibit B. In the event of a conflict between terms in the Agreement, in applicable Exhibit B shall control.
- 4.2. Connecticut General will report to Employer on each Performance Guarantee (the "Performance Reports") within the specific time frame listed in applicable Exhibit B for each specific Performance Guarantee.
- 4.3. Employer shall notify Connecticut General in writing within sixty (60) days of receiving the Performance Report of any dispute concerning the Performance Report.
- 4.4. Connecticut General shall pay to Employer any Payment Amount due under the Performance Report after the Guarantee Period. Upon prior written notice to Employer, Connecticut General may offset the Payment Amount against any payments owed by Employer to Connecticut General.
- 4.5. In the event that Employer fails to perform under the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies in a way that adversely affects Connecticut General's ability to perform one of the functions being measured in a

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Performance Guarantee, Connecticut General reserves the right to reasonably adjust the Payment Amount, if any, to account for Employer's act or omission. Connecticut General will provide notice of such adjustment to Employer. Should Employer not agree to the adjustment amount, Employer will notify Connecticut General of its objection. The Parties agree to meet and discuss such objections and come to mutual agreement on resolution.

- 4.6. Performance Reports measure results for the entire Guarantee Period. Any quarterly or other periodic results shared with Employer are for informational purposes only.
- 4.7. No third party audit results will be used to measure Performance Guarantees.
- 4.8. Payment Amounts are based on the Projected Population and/or total amount of fees expected to be paid by Employer to Connecticut General under the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies. Payment Amounts are subject to change by Connecticut General in the event that the Projected Population and/or total amount of fees paid by Employer under the applicable Service Agreements and/or Policies during the Guarantee Period changes as described in the applicable Services Agreement.

Section 5. – Measurement Methodology/Changes

- 5.1. Connecticut General shall apply its standard methodology, consistent with industry standards, to measure Performance Guarantees. Additional information about methodology for specific Performance Guarantees, if applicable, is detailed in applicable Exhibit B. Industry standard codes, including but not limited to CPT, ICD-9, NDC and CDT codes, that are set by the industry or a government agency are subject to update/change. Any such updates/changes occurring after the Effective Date will be deemed incorporated into this Agreement without further action required by the parties.

- 5.2. Connecticut General may replace or modify Performance Guarantees if necessitated by a change in the way Connecticut General systematically tracks or measures the applicable Performance Guarantee. Any substitute Performance Guarantee will, to the extent reasonably possible, attempt to reflect the same underlying objective and performance level reflected in the original Performance Guarantee, consistent with its new measurement/tracking methodology. Connecticut General shall explain the reasons for the change of a Performance Guarantee and the specifics of the substitute Performance Guarantee in writing at least 30 days prior to such change.

Section 6. – Agreement Modification

This Agreement constitutes the entire contract between the parties relating to the subject matter herein and no modification or amendment hereto shall be valid unless it is in writing and signed by an officer of Employer and by Connecticut General's Regional Financial Officer.

Section 7. – Laws Governing Contract

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Connecticut without regard to conflict of law rules, and both parties consent to the venue and jurisdiction of its courts.

Section 8. - Resolution of Disputes

- 8.1. Any dispute between the parties arising from or relating to the performance or interpretation of this Agreement ("Controversy") shall be resolved exclusively pursuant to the following mandatory dispute resolution procedures:
 - 8.1.1. Any Controversy shall first be referred for "Executive Review". The disputing party shall give the other party written notice of the Controversy and request Executive Review. Within twenty (20) days of such written request, the receiving party shall respond to the other in writing. The notice and the response shall each include a



summary of and support for the party's position. Within thirty (30) days of the request for Executive Review, an employee of each party, with full authority to resolve the dispute, shall meet and attempt to resolve the dispute.

- 8.1.2. If the Controversy has not been resolved within thirty-five (35) calendar days of the request of Executive Review under Section 8.1.1 above, the parties agree to mediate the Controversy in accordance with the following procedure ("Mediation"). The Mediation shall be conducted in Bridgeport, Connecticut in front of a neutral panel of three (3) people; one of which shall be selected by the Employer, one of which shall be selected by Connecticut General, and one of which shall be selected by mutual agreement of the parties. Each party shall assume its own costs and attorneys fees. The mediator's compensation and expenses of the mediator and any administrative fees or costs associated with the Mediation proceeding shall be borne equally by the parties.
- 8.1.3. If the Controversy has not been resolved by Executive Review or Mediation, the Controversy shall be settled exclusively by binding arbitration. The arbitration shall be conducted in the same location as noted in Section 8.1.2 above, in accordance with the American Health Lawyers Association Alternative Dispute Resolution Service Rules of Procedure for Arbitration. The arbitration shall be binding on the parties to the Agreement and on any respective affiliates which joined the arbitration. The arbitrators' decision shall be final, conclusive and binding, and no action at law or in equity may be instituted by either party other than to enforce the arbitrators' award. Judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrators may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. Each party shall assume its own costs and attorneys fees. The arbitrators' compensation and expenses and any administrative fees or costs associated with the arbitration proceeding shall be borne equally by the Parties.

8.1.4. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

Section 9. – Third Party Beneficiaries

This Agreement is for the benefit of Employer and Connecticut General. It shall not be construed to create any legal relationship between Connecticut General and any other party.

Section 10. – Assignment and Subcontracting

No assignment of rights or interests hereunder shall be binding unless approved in writing by a duly authorized officer of each of the parties.

Section 11. – Nondisclosure

This Agreement, the information Connecticut General reports to Employer in connection with this Agreement, including the Performance Guarantee Reports, the Payment Amounts and the Maximum Payment Amounts, are proprietary and confidential. Employer shall maintain the confidentiality of this Agreement and any information provided to Employer pursuant to this Agreement and shall not disclose either this Agreement nor said information to any other party without the express written consent of Connecticut General; provided however, that Employer may disclose the terms of this Agreement if required by law or court order. Should Employer receive a court order to disclose Confidential Information, Employer agrees to provide Connecticut General with immediate notice of any request that it disclose Confidential Information so that Connecticut General may object to the request and/or seek an appropriate protective order. If such notice is prohibited by law, Employer shall disclose the minimum amount of Confidential Information required to be disclosed under the applicable legal mandate.

Section 12. – Waivers

No course of dealing or failure of either party to strictly enforce any term, right or condition of this

CIGNA HealthCare Performance Guarantee Agreement

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Agreement shall be construed as a waiver of such term, right or condition. Waiver by either party of any default shall not be deemed a waiver of any other default.

Section 13. – Headings

Article, section, or paragraph headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement.

Section 14. – Survival

Provisions contained in this Agreement that by their sense and context are intended to survive completion of performance, termination or cancellation of this Agreement shall so survive.

Section 15. – Force Majeure

Connecticut General shall not be liable for any failure to meet any of the obligations required under this Agreement where such failure to perform is due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of Connecticut General, its employees, officers, or directors. Such contingencies include, but are not limited to, acts or omissions of any person or entity not employed or reasonably controlled by Connecticut General, its employees, officers, or directors, acts of God, fires, wars, accidents, labor disputes or shortages, and governmental laws, ordinances, rules or regulations.

Section 16. – Notices

Except as otherwise provided, all notices or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly made when (a)

delivered in person, (b) delivered to an agent, such as an overnight or similar delivery service, (c) delivered electronically, or (d) deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:

EXHIBIT B1 - IMPLEMENTATION

1. Additional Definitions

- 1.1. Commitment Dates – The dates by when Connecticut General must perform specific implementation services, as set forth in the Implementation Calendar.
- 1.2. Implementation Calendar – The schedule that sets out the mutually agreed upon obligations for Employer and Connecticut General in connection with the implementation of the Plan.
- 1.3. Service Center(s) – A claim processing office of Connecticut General that processes Claims and receives and responds to Plan Participant telephone calls.

2. Additional Conditions Precedent

- 2.1. Benefit Profiles are finalized and provided to Connecticut General by Employer at least 60 days prior to the Effective Date or Connecticut General confirms that the non-standard design and structure can not be reasonably implemented at least 30 days prior to the Effective Date.
- 2.2. Employer or its designated agent provides to Connecticut General eligibility information for Plan Participants that is accurate, complete, accessible, and timely under the predetermined schedule.
- 2.3. The Implementation Calendar has been finalized and approved by Employer and Connecticut General prior to the Effective Date.
- 2.4. Employer has fulfilled its obligations in the Implementation Calendar, including timely, accurate and complete Participant eligibility information and Benefit Profiles.
- 2.5. In order for the Overall Satisfaction Guarantee to be binding, Employer must return the completed Account Implementation Survey within thirty (30) days of receipt, in accordance with paragraph 3.3 below.

3. Additional Terms

- 3.1. The Guarantee Period for the Implementation Performance Guarantees is six (6) months beginning on the Effective Date.
- 3.2. Implementation Performance Guarantees shall be measured solely based on the timely, complete and accurate information provided by Employer or its designee to Connecticut General as of the due dates set forth in the Implementation Calendar.
- 3.3. Connecticut General will provide to Employer the Account Implementation Survey within 30 days of the Effective Date. Within 30 days thereafter, Employer will forward the Account Implementation Survey to mutually agreed upon members of Employer's benefits staff and return the completed surveys to Connecticut General. Statement 1 of the Account Implementation Survey states that the overall implementation by Connecticut General as set forth in the Implementation Calendar, met the Employer's needs; a score of "3" means that the Employer, as measured by an average of the designated members of Employer's benefit staff, neither agrees nor disagrees with Statement 1.

4. Performance Metrics

4.1. Identification Card Delivery

- 4.1.1. Identification Card Performance Measurement - Identification Cards performance will be calculated by counting the number of Business Days from the Business Day that eligibility information necessary to issue that card is released to the ID card vendor, to and including the Business Day that the ID card is issued to the Plan Participant. The Business Day the eligibility information is received by the ID card vendor will not be included in this calculation.

4.2. Claim Readiness

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4.2.1. Claim Readiness Performance Measurement

– Claim Readiness will be calculated by determining whether all complete and accurate eligibility information for each eligible participant under the Plan has been loaded on Connecticut General's claims processing system as of the Commitment Date set forth in the approved Implementation Calendar.

4.3. Call Readiness

4.3.1. Call Readiness Performance Measurement –

Call Readiness will be calculated by determining whether the Plan specifications are loaded into the applicable inquiry system with the Service Center(s) ready to respond to customer inquiries as of the Commitment Date set forth in the approved Implementation Calendar.

4.4. Overall Satisfaction with Implementation Services

4.4.1. Overall Satisfaction with Implementation Services Measurement - The Employer shall be satisfied with the Implementation process, as reflected by a score of no less than "3" on Statement 1 of an Account Implementation Survey to be distributed to the Employer by Connecticut General. Statement 1 recites

that the overall implementation of the account or account changes met the Employer's needs. A score of "3" will mean that the Employer neither agrees nor disagrees with this statement. The Account Implementation Survey shall be provided to the Employer within thirty (30) calendar days of the Plan Effective Date; the Employer shall return the completed Account Implementation Survey results to Connecticut General within thirty (30) days of receipt. The Account Implementation Survey shall be distributed to appropriate members of the Employer's benefits staff, and the above score shall be the average of all of the staff members' scores on Statement 1.

5. Evaluation of Performance and Payment Amounts

5.1. Within four (4) months of completion of Implementation, Connecticut General shall compile the necessary documentation and perform the necessary calculations to evaluate its fulfillment of each performance commitment set forth in this Agreement and make this information available to the Employer.



EXHIBIT B2 - SERVICE

1. **Additional Definitions**
 - 1.1. **Account Level** – The performance commitment is measured with respect to Employer’s claims processed during the Guarantee Period.
 - 1.2. **Average Speed to Answer** - The sum of the total elapsed time between the moment when a telephone call is queued to the Call Center(s) and the time the call is responded to.
 - 1.3. **Call Center** – Member service center of Connecticut General that receives and responds to Plan Participant telephone calls.
 - 1.4. **Claim** – Refers to claims received by Connecticut General under the Plan(s). If the term “claim” is used without a capital c, it refers to claims received by Connecticut General, whether under the Employer’s Plan(s) or under other plans.
 - 1.5. **Connecticut General’s Standard Quality Assurance Audit Methodology** - The objective of audit claim quality is to measure claim accuracy by identifying claim payment or processing errors that are based on data available to the claim processor at the time/day the claim was paid, that caused incorrect payment or correspondence that has a customer impact and that results in correctional work by Connecticut General.
 - 1.6. **Customer Service Representative (“CSA”)** – A person responding to callers at a Call Center.
 - 1.7. **Inquiry** – An answered call, received at a Call Center, about the services Connecticut General provides to the Plan(s).
 - 1.8. **Maintenance Eligibility** – Means additions, deletions and changes in eligibility that are processed during the Guarantee Period. Maintenance Eligibility does not include any eligibility loads that are done at or before the beginning of the plan year to prepare for Plan administration.
 - 1.9. **Maintenance ID Cards** – Means ID Cards issued during the Guarantee Period for changes in member address, changes in enrollment, etc. Maintenance ID Cards does not include the initial issuance of ID cards at the beginning of the Plan year.
 - 1.10. **Office Level** – The performance commitment is measured using a random sample of all the claims processed at the Service Center(s) on the same claim engine that processes Employer’s Claims. And, for all Vision Plan performance guarantees, Office Level shall mean that the performance commitment is measured using a random sample of all vision claims processed across the entire book of vision business.
 - 1.11. **Processed** – A Claim/claim shall be considered “processed” when Connecticut General has made a determination as to whether the billed services are covered and, if covered, determined the amount of reimbursement.
 - 1.12. **Service Center** – A claim processing office of Connecticut General that processes Claims.
 - 1.13. **Special Account Queue** – A defined group of customer service associates that handle a specific block of business with similar ASA and abandonment rate requirements. The SAQ refers to a specific call queue to which an account belongs. For measurement purposes, results are derived by compiling statistics for all accounts within that particular queue.
2. **Performance Metrics**
 - 2.1. **Claim Time-to-Process (TTP)**
 - 2.1.1. **Time-to-Process Measurement** - Time-to-Process will be calculated by counting the number of Business Days or calendar days (as appropriate) from the day that a Claim is



received by Connecticut General to and including the day the Claim is processed. The day that the Claim is received will not be included in this calculation.

2.2. Claim Quality

2.2.1. Financial Accuracy

2.2.1.1. Financial Accuracy Measurement - Financial Accuracy Performance Commitment will be determined by applying Connecticut General's Standard Quality Assurance Audit Methodology to a statistically valid sample of Claims (Account Level) or claims (Office Level) processed during the Guarantee Period.

Financial Accuracy represents the sum of the absolute value of total dollars overpaid and the total dollars underpaid subtracted from the total dollars paid, divided by the total dollars paid, expressed as a percent. Overpayments and underpayments are determined from auditing a statistically valid sample of claims paid during the period.

2.2.2. Claim Processing Accuracy (Overall Accuracy)

2.2.2.1. Claim Processing Accuracy (Overall Accuracy) Measurement - Claim Processing Accuracy (Overall Accuracy) Performance Commitment will be determined by applying Connecticut General's Standard Quality Assurance Audit Methodology to a statistically valid sample of Claims (Account Level) or claims (Office Level) processed during the Guarantee Period.

Claim Processing Accuracy (Overall Accuracy) represents the total number of claims processed without any errors (both financial and non-financial errors) divided by the total claims processed, expressed as a percent. The calculation of claims paid with error is determined from auditing a statistically valid sample of claims paid during the period.

2.3. Inquiry

2.3.1. Average Speed of Answer (ASA)

2.3.1.1. ASA Measurement - The ASA will be determined by measuring the sum of the total elapsed time between the moment when a telephone call is queued to the Call Center(s) and the time the call is responded to for all answered calls to the Call Center(s), and then dividing that number by the total number of telephone calls answered in the Call Center(s) during the Guarantee Period.

The calculation of ASA is either based on all Inquiries (Account Level) or on all calls received by the Call Center(s) that are serviced in the Special Account Queue.

2.3.2. Call Abandonment Rate

2.3.2.1. Call Abandonment Rate Measurement - The Call Abandonment Rate will be calculated as the total number of calls received during the Guarantee Period that result in the caller terminating the call after it is queued to a CSA, divided by the total number of telephone calls received by the Call Center(s) during the Guarantee Period, expressed as a percent.

The calculation of Call Abandonment Rate is based on all Inquiries (Account Level) or on all calls received by the Call Center(s) during the Guarantee Period that are serviced in the Special Account Queue.

2.3.3. First Call Resolution

2.3.3.1. First Call Resolution Measurement - An Inquiry will be considered closed on first inquiry when Connecticut General gives it a closed status on the Inquiry Tracking System(s) and no Inquiries involving the same matter are received during the 45 day period prior to the Inquiry or during the 45 day period following the Inquiry.

The First Call Resolution rate will be calculated by dividing the number of Inquiries that were closed on first inquiry during the Guarantee Period by the total



number of Inquiries received during the Guarantee Period, expressed as a percent.

2.4. **Employer Service**

2.4.1. **Automated Maintenance Eligibility Processing***

*This Performance Guarantee shall not apply if Employer is using the Enrollment Maintenance Tool.

2.4.1.1. **Condition Precedent** – This Maintenance Eligibility Processing Commitment is contingent upon the submission by Employer (or Employer’s agent) of full electronic eligibility files containing no more than two (2) percent erroneous records. An “erroneous record” is defined as any Plan Participant record lacking any of the accurate information necessary to correctly administer benefits, such as: correct spelling of the Plan Participant’s name; applicable Social Security Number; date of birth; account number; division (if any); branch number; information to correctly identify plan and benefit structure, such as benefit option code, benefit structure, plan code, plan type, network ID (if the Plan uses provider networks); effective date of coverage; termination date; HIPAA privacy information (if any); member address and any other demographic data.

2.4.1.2. **Maintenance Eligibility Processing Measurement** - Maintenance Eligibility Processing will be calculated by counting the number of Business Days from the Business Day that the file is received by Connecticut General to and including the Business Day the file is entered into the Connecticut General eligibility system. The Business Day the file is received will not be included in this calculation.

Maintenance Eligibility Processing performance will be calculated by dividing the number of eligibility files that met the performance standard during the Guarantee Period by the total number of eligibility files processed, expressed as a percent.

2.4.2. **Maintenance ID Cards**

2.4.2.1. **Maintenance ID Cards Measurement** -

Maintenance ID Cards performance will be calculated by counting the number of Business Days from the Business Day that eligibility information necessary to issue that card is released to the ID card vendor, to and including the Business Day that the ID card is issued to the Plan Participant. The Business Day the eligibility information is received by the ID card vendor will not be included in this calculation.

Maintenance ID Cards performance will be calculated by dividing the number of ID cards that were issued to Plan Participants within the designated number of Business Days during the Guarantee Period by the total number of ID cards issued to Plan Participants during the Guarantee Period, expressed as a percent.

2.5. **Account Management**

2.5.1. **Account Management Measurement** –

Connecticut General’s Account Management Sales Team commits to providing services to Employer of such quality as will result in Connecticut General’s achieving, on the Account Management Report Card (sample available upon request), the designated Account Management Composite Score.

2.5.2. **Account Management Condition Precedent** –

This commitment is contingent on Employer completing its obligations in the “Evaluation of Account Management” as follows: subsection below, on a quarterly basis.

2.5.3. **Evaluation of Account Management** -

At the beginning of the Term, Employer shall designate individuals on its benefits staff who will receive and complete the Account Management Report Card on a quarterly basis.

The Account Management Report Card will be distributed to Employer’s designated staff members on a quarterly basis, shall be completed, signed and dated by them, and all returned to Connecticut General by



Employer within three (3) weeks of the distribution date. Failure of Employer to meet its obligations in this subparagraph and the subparagraph above shall nullify the Account Management Commitment.

Following the end of the Term and receipt of the fourth (4th) quarterly survey from Employer, Connecticut General will calculate the Composite Score in each performance assessment category by averaging the scores for the four (4) quarters of the Term. The assessments of each of the designated staff members and each of the performance assessment categories will be weighted equally. The Account Management Commitment will be deemed fulfilled if the average of the composite scores in each category ("Account Management Composite Score") is equal to or greater than the Account Management Composite Score indicated on Exhibit A.

3. **Evaluation of Performance and Payment Amounts**

3.1. Within four (4) months after the end of the Term, Connecticut General shall compile the

necessary documentation and perform the necessary calculations to evaluate its fulfillment of each performance commitment set forth in this Agreement and make this information available to Employer.

The Payment Amounts in Exhibit A have been established in relationship to the Projected Population. In the event that the actual number of employees enrolled on the Effective Date is greater than one-hundred and fifteen percent (115%) of the projected number, the Employer reserves the right to increase the Payment Amounts in proportion to the variation between the actual and projected number of enrolled employees. Correspondingly, Connecticut General reserves the right to decrease the Payment Amounts in proportion to the variation between the actual and projected number of enrolled employees in the event that the actual number of employees enrolled on the Effective Date is less than eighty-five percent (85%) of the projected number.

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1. **Additional Definitions**
 - 1.1. **Actual Discount** – The weighted average of all Service Area Discounts.
 - 1.2. **Covered Charges** – The fee-for-service charges submitted for reimbursement under the Plan by Participating Providers for Covered Services, calculated as if there were no Discounts.
 - 1.3. **Covered Services** – Health care services and supplies that are covered under the in-network coverage of the Plan.
 - 1.4. **Discount Target** – The weighted average of the Service Area Discount Targets.
 - 1.5. **Eligible Charges** – Covered Charges minus discounts.
 - 1.6. **Fees at Risk** – The portion of network access fees that will be used to calculate the amount that either party may be required to pay the other under this Agreement.
 - 1.7. **Plan** – The program of medical welfare benefits which Employer has adopted for its Plan Participants and which is administered by Connecticut General. The term “Plan” shall include each change, as of its effective date, which has been adopted by Employer and accepted by Connecticut General as compatible with its guarantee obligations hereunder. Such adoption and acceptance shall be documented in a writing executed by an authorized officer of each of the parties.
 - 1.8. **Service Area** – Means a location, listed in Table 1, where In-Network Services are available under the Plan.
 - 1.9. **Service Area Discount** – The discount that is calculated by dividing the Eligible Charges by the Covered Charges and subtracting the result from one (1). [Example – if Covered Charges are \$100 and Eligible Charges are \$75, then 75 divided by 100 is .75; one minus .75 is .25, or a 25% discount].
 - 1.10. **Service Area Discount Target** – Means the percentage discount from Covered Charges that Connecticut General expects to achieve through its Participating Provider Agreements during the Guarantee Period for all Covered Services in a given Service Area. The Service Area Discount Target for each Service Area is identified in Table 1.
 - 1.11. **Service Termination Date** – The date on which the Connecticut General Service Agreements and/or Policies with respect to the Plan ends (not counting any run-out periods).
2. **Additional Conditions Precedent**
 - 2.1. The guarantee applies only to Service Areas approved by Connecticut General and identified in Table 1.
 - 2.2. This Discount Performance Guarantee agreement and the calculations herein do not apply to:
 - 2.2.1. Charges that are not fee-for service charges (e.g. capitation payments);
 - 2.2.2. Charges for services/supplies that are not Covered Services (such as COB, plan exclusions, UM denials, pended/duplicate claims, etc.);
 - 2.2.3. Charges made by providers that are not Participating Providers in a Service Area;
 - 2.2.4. Services provided under an agreement with a provider where all billed charges equal negotiated discounted charges (such as Gentiva, NIA, etc.);
 - 2.2.5. Charges made by any CIGNA company (e.g., including but not limited to Tel-Drug, Inc., Tel-Drug of Pennsylvania, Inc., CIGNA Behavioral Health and CIGNA HealthCare of Arizona, Inc.’s staff model);
 - 2.2.6. Claims exceeding \$100,000, which will be removed in their entirety; and

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- 2.2.7. Claims for persons over age 65.

In the event any federal, state or local legislation or regulation (a) impacts Connecticut General's ability to enter into Participating Provider Agreements in one or more Service Areas, or (b) affects the Eligible Charges in one or more Service Areas, Connecticut General reserves the right to revise the Service Area Discount Targets to account for such changes.
- 2.4. In the event that Covered Charges remain flat or decrease in any Service Area during the Guarantee Period, Connecticut General may adjust the Service Area Discount Target for that Service Area accordingly.
- 2.5. In the event there is a substantial change (i.e. including but not limited to the addition of a new participating hospital, termination of a participating hospital) in CIGNA's network in the Service Area that affects the financial discounts expected in place, Connecticut General may revise the Performance Guarantees to account for such changes.

3. **Methodology**

- 3.1. **Discount Target** – Prior to the Guarantee Period, Connecticut General will identify the Service Area Discount Target(s) to be achieved during the Guarantee Period in each Service Area. These Service Area Discount Targets are identified in Table 1. After the end of the Guarantee Period, Connecticut General shall calculate the weighted average of all Service Area Discount Targets for the Guarantee Period. In calculating the weighted average of all Service Area Discount Targets, the proportional relevance assigned to each Service Area Discount Target will be determined by dividing the total of all Covered Charges for that Service Area during the Guarantee Period by the total Covered Charges for all Service Areas within the same period.

- 3.2. **Actual Discount** – Within five months after the end of the Guarantee Period, Connecticut General shall determine the Service Area Discount(s) actually achieved during the Guarantee Period in each Service Area. Connecticut General shall then calculate the weighted average of all the Service Area Discounts during the Guarantee Period. In calculating the weighted average of the Service Area Discounts, the proportional relevance assigned to each Service Area Discount will be determined by dividing the total Covered Charges for that Service Area during the Guarantee Period by the total Covered Charges for all Service Areas during the same period.

4. **Risk-Sharing Guarantees**

- 4.1. If the Actual Discount is within 2% - that is, that number of percentage points plus or minus of the Discount Target (the "Risk Free Corridor"), no amounts will be owed by Connecticut General under this Agreement.
- 4.2. If the Actual Discount is less than the Discount Target and not within the Risk Free Corridor, Connecticut General will pay or credit to Employer:
- 4.2.1. \$4.00 Per Employee Per Month if the Actual Discount is within 2.1 to 4 percentage points of the Discount Target; or
- 4.2.2. \$8.00 Per Employee Per Month if the Actual Discount is greater than 4 percentage points of the Discount Target.

5. **Evaluation of Performance and Payment Amounts**

- 5.1. Connecticut General shall provide the Performance Report to Employer within five (5) months following the end of the Guarantee Period.
- 5.2. Connecticut General or Employer, as the case may be, shall pay or credit to the

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other any amounts due under this Agreement within sixty (60) days following delivery by Connecticut General of the Performance Report.



EXHIBIT B4 - CLINICAL

1. Additional Definitions

- 1.1. Baseline Period - Means the twelve (12) month incurred period immediately prior to effective date of the pertinent Disease Management Program. Connecticut General reserves the right to re-establish the baseline period if it is deemed to be too historical.
- 1.2. Case Management Program - Connecticut General case management or utilization management program (including complex, specialty, and catastrophic case management and utilization management programs).
- 1.3. Client Specific - Connecticut General's performance is measured as to Employer's Participants, not the CIGNA Book of Business.
- 1.4. Claim Costs for Client Specific- Means all fee-for-service (and fee-for-service equivalents for capitated encounter data) health care costs (including all pharmacy costs) incurred under Employer's applicable Plan(s) for Covered Services provided Participants during the applicable measurement period (i.e., Baseline Period or Guarantee Period) capped at \$100,000 per Participant. "Claims Costs" do not include any Participant co-payments, coinsurance or deductible amounts or any Well Aware Program charges paid by the Employer. For purposes of this definition, a cost is "incurred" on the date that a Covered Service is provided to a Participant not the date the Plan pays the cost.
- 1.5. Core 5 Well Aware - The Core 5 Well Aware programs are: Asthma Disease Management Program, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) Disease Management Program, Diabetes Disease Management Program, Heart Disease Management Program, Low Back Pain Disease Management.
- 1.6. Covered Services for Client Specific - Means health care (including pharmacy) services and/or supplies that are covered under Employer's applicable Plans.
- 1.7. Disease Management Maximum - The maximum Payment Amount that applies if none of the Disease Management Guarantees are met during the Guarantee Period. The exposure is determined on a pro-rata basis for this measure. For example, if the Guarantee Period results are 90% of the target results, then only 10% of the fees at risk will be paid or credited to Employer.
- 1.8. Documented Care Plan - A documented plan for a complex, catastrophic, and specialty intensity case management case where there is documented verbal consent from the Plan Participant for case management services and where the plan at a minimum identifies one (1) short term goal, one (1) long term goal and one (1) exit goal.
- 1.9. ETG - Stands for Episode Treatment Group, a methodology developed by Symmetry Health and used for measuring compliance with the Pharmacy guarantees.
- 1.10. HEDIS Measure Rotation - Shall be defined as Connecticut General's use of the audited and reportable rate from the prior year's data collection in lieu of collecting the measure for the Guarantee Period, based on NCQA approved methodology.
- 1.11. Medical Management - Full Program - Means the full array of Connecticut



General/CIGNA's medical management services (i.e., prior-authorization of specialty care, pre-certification of inpatient admissions, continued stay review of in-patient care, and case management).

1.12. NCQA Quality Compass National

Average – Calculated by the National Committee for Quality Assurance from a pool of 400+ public and non-public reporting health plan products.

1.13. Participant - Means the Plan Participants enrolled in the specific Well Aware program. For purposes of Disease Management programs, there are Asthma Participants, Cardiac Participants, COPD Participants, Diabetes Participants and LBP Participants. Disease management "Participants" (a) have been diagnosed as having one of the five targeted chronic diseases and have been identified as such by the specific disease identifying methodology or their treating physician, (b) their diagnosis has been made known to Connecticut General, (c) they have not voluntarily opted out of the disease-specific Well Aware Program, and (d) they are not a participant in another Well Aware Program for another chronic disease.

1.14. PDPPM Costs– For Client Specific measures stands for Per Disease Participant Per Month costs and means the Claims Costs for the Participants for a given period of time (i.e., the Guarantee Period or the Baseline Period). The PDPPM Costs for the Baseline Period are determined by Connecticut General following a baseline analysis using Employer's Medical Management Claims Set for the Baseline Period. Employer's Medical Management Claims Set means the medical and prescription drug claim history with respect to the Disease Management Programs associated with the Performance Guarantees identified in Exhibit A.

1.15. ROI – Return on Investment measures dollars saved by a specified program against dollars spent by Employer on that specified program.

1.16. Savings Target – Measures claim dollars saved by a specific program. See specific measurement methodology in applicable Exhibit B for each Performance Guarantee with a Savings Target.

2. Additional Conditions Precedent

2.1. Connecticut General shall not be obligated to provide the Client Specific Clinical Performance Guarantees if any one or more of the following occurs:

2.1.1. The number of Employees enrolled on the Effective Date is less than 90% or greater than 110% of the Projected Population;

2.1.2. There is a 20% or greater turnover in Plan Participants during the Term;

2.1.3. Less than 70% of all the Plan Participants' contact information provided to Connecticut General by Employer or its designated agent is accurate, as reasonably determined by Connecticut General;

2.2. For all Clinical Performance Guarantees, Employer must have a minimum of 500 Employees in the Plan administered by Connecticut General for the entire Term of this Agreement.

2.3. Client's disease prevalence is not below CIGNA book average by more than 5%

2.4. Client's medical and pharmaceutical cost PDMPM is not below CIGNA book average by more than 10%



3. Additional Terms

3.1. The Guarantee Periods for specific Performance Guarantees are set forth in Exhibit A, beginning on the Effective Date.

4. Disease Management Metrics

4.1. Additional Conditions

4.1.1. For Disease Management Performance Guarantees, (a) Employer must have purchased the Disease Management programs for a minimum of 3000 Participants in each of the Disease Management programs listed in Exhibit A, (b) Employer must have purchased the Medical Management – Full Program, (c) Employers must make available to Connecticut General required historical claim data and pharmacy claim data to establish the Baseline Period, and (d) Employers new to Connecticut General must complete the “jumpstart” process prior to the Effective Date which combines historical claim data and pharmacy claim data for the Baseline Period with current eligibility information.

4.1.2. For the Disease Management Saving Target Performance Guarantee Employer must purchase the 5 Core Well Aware Programs.. Client specific Savings Target Guarantee calculation does not include fees nor the savings realized through Weight Complications, Depression or Targeted Condition program.

4.1.3. For the clinical improvement guarantee(s), Employer must purchase and retain for the duration of the Guarantee Period the program associated with the performance guarantee(s). For example, to be eligible for Improvement in the percentage of Asthma Participants with persistent asthma who are prescribed asthma medication, Employer must purchase Asthma Program.

4.1.4. Connecticut General will use required historical pharmacy claim data and historical claim data provided by Employer to establish the Baseline Period, along with the “jumpstart” program for new Employers that combines the Baseline Period information with current Participant eligibility information, to identify Participants with chronic disease conditions for participation in Well Aware Programs and to evaluate Disease Management Performance Guarantees.

4.1.5. Plan Participants with more than one chronic disease (defined here as Asthma, Diabetes, Cardiac (Chronic Heart Disease/CHD), Lower Back Pain (LBP) and Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) will only be considered to have one primary diagnosis (e.g. an Asthma Participant will not also be considered a Diabetes or CHD Participant).

4.1.6. Client Specific Savings Target guarantee calculation does not include fees or the savings realized through Weight Complications, Depression or Targeted Condition program.

4.1.7. Retirees are included.

4.2. Disease Management Measurement - Performance Guarantees shall be measured using the Detailed Measurement Methodology set forth in Table 1, which may be periodically adjusted to reflect Connecticut General’s current practices. Connecticut General incorporates three (3) months of run-out claim experience related to the Guarantee Period in conducting its analysis of the performance of the Well Aware Program.

4.3. Savings Target Measurement - Reduction in health care costs will be determined by Connecticut General by comparing the PDPPM Costs for the Guarantee Period to the PDPPM Costs for the Baseline

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Period using the Detailed Measurement Methodology set forth in Table 1. Connecticut General reserves the right to periodically adjust the Detailed Measurement Methodology to reflect its then current industry best practices. For the Savings Target Guarantee, the health care cost reduction will be expressed as a percent of the Baseline Period PDPPM Costs. Connecticut General reserves the right to re-evaluate the Savings Target Guarantee should Employer's disease prevalence be lower than CIGNA Book of Business average by more than five (5) percent and should the medical and pharmaceutical cost paid PDMPM be below CIGNA Book of Business by more than ten (10) percent.

4.4. Evaluation of Performance and Payment Amounts - Connecticut General shall provide to Employer a written report using the Well Aware Program Report Methodology (see Table 1) with respect to the Disease Management Guarantees within one-hundred-eighty (180) days following the end of the Guarantee Period. Connecticut General shall report performance with respect to the Disease Management Guarantees in the aggregate.



Table 1 – Detailed Measurement Methodology for Disease Management Guarantees – Client Specific

Detailed Measurement Methodology: Appropriate use of Medications

Denominator: Number of Asthma Participants* who:

1. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility in the Baseline Period;
2. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility and program participation history in the Guarantee Period;
3. did not voluntarily opt out of the Asthma Well Aware Program;
4. did not claim to have been falsely identified with Asthma, and are not deceased.

The Denominator will be calculated by Connecticut General using data in the CIGNA HealthCare Well Aware Clinical Information System.

Numerator: The number of Asthma Participants included in the Denominator who participated during the Guarantee Period. The numerator will be calculated by Connecticut General using the Employer's Medical Management Claims Set. To be included in the numerator, the Participant must:

1. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility in the Baseline Period;
2. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility and program exposure in the Guarantee Period.

Detailed Measurement Methodology: LDL

Denominator: The number of CHD* and Diabetes Participants who:

1. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility in the Baseline Period;
2. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility and program participation history in the Guarantee Period;
3. did not voluntarily opt out of the cardiac Well Aware Program;
4. did not claim to have been falsely identified with coronary heart disease, and
5. are not deceased.

The Denominator will be calculated by Connecticut General using data in the CIGNA HealthCare Well Aware Clinical Information System.

Numerator: The number of CHD and Diabetes Participants included in the Denominator who participated during the Guarantee Period. The numerator will be calculated by Connecticut General using the Employer's Medical Management Claims Set. To be included in the numerator, the Participant must:

1. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility in the Baseline Period;
2. have no less than ten (10) months of eligibility and program exposure in the Guarantee Period.

* Participants are defined in Exhibit B.



Detailed Measurement Methodology: Cost of Care Reduction

PDPPM* Costs for the Baseline Period* and the Guarantee Period* will be calculated. After adjusting the Baseline Period PDPPM Costs for inflation (calculated by applying the Connecticut General determined trend of PDPPM claims for all of Connecticut General's customers), an annual reduction percentage will be calculated by taking the difference between the Guarantee Period PDPPM Costs and the inflation adjusted Baseline Period PDPPM Costs and then expressing that difference as a percentage of the inflation-adjusted Baseline Period PDPPM Costs. For purposes of this calculation only those Participants who have at least ten (10) months of eligibility or claim history during the applicable twelve (12) month period (i.e. the Baseline Period or the Guarantee Period) and ten (10) months of program exposure in the Guarantee Period, shall be considered. Each Baseline and Guarantee Period will include three (3) months of claims run-out.

* These terms are defined in Exhibit B.

15.44.010 Findings of fact.

- A. The flood hazard areas of Bridgeport are subject to periodic inundation which may result in loss of life and property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base, all of which adversely affect the public health, safety and general welfare.
- B. These flood losses are caused by the cumulative effect of obstructions in floodplains causing increases in flood heights and velocities, and by the occupancy in flood hazard areas by uses vulnerable to floods or hazardous to other lands which are inadequately elevated, floodproofed, or otherwise unprotected from flood damages.

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15.44.020 Statement of purpose.

It is the purpose of this chapter to promote the public health, safety and general welfare, and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas by provisions designed:

- A. To protect human life and health;
- B. To minimize expenditure of public money for costly flood control projects;
- C. To minimize the need for rescue and relief efforts associated with flooding and generally undertaken at the expense of the general public;
- D. To minimize prolonged business interruptions;
- E. To minimize damage to public facilities and utilities, such as: water and gas mains; electric, telephone and sewer lines; streets and bridges located in areas of special flood hazard;
- F. To help maintain a stable tax base by providing for the second use and development of areas of special flood hazard so as to minimize future flood blight areas;
- G. To insure that potential buyers are notified that property is in an area of special flood hazard; and
- H. To ensure that those who occupy the areas of special flood hazard assume responsibility for their actions.

15.44.030 Methods of reducing flood losses.

In order to accomplish its purposes, this chapter includes methods and provisions for:

- A. Restricting or prohibiting uses which are dangerous to health, safety and property due to water or erosion hazards, or which result in damaging increases in erosion or in flood heights or velocities;
- B. Requiring that uses vulnerable to floods, including facilities which serve such uses, be protected against flood damage at the time of initial construction;

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- C. Controlling the alteration of natural floodplains, stream channels, and natural protective barriers, which help accommodate or channel floodwaters;
- D. Controlling filling, grading, dredging and other development which may increase flood damage; and
- E. Preventing or regulating the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert floodwaters or which may increase flood hazards in other areas.

15.44.040 Definitions.

Unless specifically defined in this section, words or phrases used in this chapter shall be interpreted so as to give them the meaning they have in common usage and to give this chapter its more reasonable application:

"Appeal" means a request for a review of the city engineer's interpretation of any provision of this chapter or a request for a variance.

"Area of special flood hazard" means the land in the floodplain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year.

"Base flood" means the flood having a one percent chance equalled or exceeded in any given year.

"Base Flood Elevation" means the elevation of the crest of the base flood or 100-year flood. The height in relation to mean sea level expected to be reached by the waters of the base flood at pertinent points in the floodplains of coastal and riverine areas.

"Basement" means any area of the building having its floor subgrade below ground level, on all sides

"Breakaway walls" means any type of walls, whether solid or lattice, and whether constructed of concrete, masonry, wood, metal, plastic or any other suitable building material which are not part of the structural support of the building; and which are so designed as to break away under abnormally high tides or wave action without damage to the structural integrity of the building on which they are used, or any buildings to which

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they might be carried by flood waters.

"Building" means any structure built for support, shelter or enclosure for any occupancy or storage.

"Coastal high hazard area" means the area of special flood hazard subject to high velocity waters, including, but not limited to, hurricane wave wash. The area is designated on a Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) as Zone (~~V1-30,~~) VE (~~or V-~~)

"Development" means a manmade change to improved or unimproved real estate, including, but not limited to, the construction of buildings or other structures; the construction of additions, alterations or substantial improvements to buildings or structures; the placement of buildings or structures; mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation, drilling operations or storage of equipment; the storage, deposition, or extraction of (or) materials; and the installation, repair or removal of public or private sewage disposal systems or water supply facilities located within the area of special flood hazard.

"Elevated building." In the FEMA-issued definition for elevated building, combined specifications are given for structures in A zones and V zones. The definitions for elevated buildings in A zones and for V zones follow:

1. "Elevated building--A and A1-A-30 zones" means a nonbasement building built to have the top of the elevated floor elevated above the ground level by means of pilings, columns (posts and piers), or shear walls or by means of fill or solid foundation perimeter walls with openings sufficient to facilitate the unimpeded movement of floodwaters.
2. "Elevated building--V and V1-V30 zones" means a nonbasement building built to have the bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member of the elevated floor elevated above the ground level by means of pilings, columns (posts and piers), or shear walls parallel to the flow of water and adequately anchored so as not to impair the structural integrity of the building during a flood of the magnitude of the base flood. Elevated building also includes structures which have the lower area enclosed by means of breakaway walls if the breakaway walls meet the standards of Section 15.44.150(C)(2)(d).

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"Existing manufactured home park or subdivision" means a manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, as a minimum, the installation utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed before the effective date, October 15, 1980, of the floodplain management ordinance adopted by the community.

"Expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision" means the preparation of additional sites by the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufacturing homes are to be affixed (including the installation of utilities, the construction of street, and either final grading or the pouring of concrete pads).

"Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)" is the federal agency that administers the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

"Flood" or "flooding" means a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from:

1. The overflow of inland or tidal waters, and/or
2. The unusual and rapid accumulation of runoff of surface waters from any source.

("Flood boundary and floodway map" means the official map on which the Federal Emergency Management Agency has delineated the boundaries of the floodway.)

"Flood insurance rate map (FIRM)" means the official map on which the Federal **Emergency Management Agency** (~~Insurance Administration~~) has delineated both the area of special flood hazards and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.

"Flood insurance study (**FIS**)" means the official report provided in which the Federal **Emergency Management Agency** (~~Insurance Administration~~) has provided flood profiles, as well as **Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM)** (~~Flood Hazard Boundary-Floodway Map~~) and the water surface elevation of the base flood.

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"Floodway" means the channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than one foot.

"Floor" means the top surface of an enclosed area in a building (including basement) i.e., top of slab in concrete slab construction or top of wood flooring in wood frame construction. The term does not include the floor of a garage used solely for parking vehicles.

"Functionally dependent facility" means a facility which cannot be used for its intended purpose unless it is located in close proximity to water. **The term includes only docking facilities, port facilities that are necessary for the loading and unloading of cargo or passengers, and ship building and ship repair facilities. The term does not include seafood processing facilities, long term storage, manufacturing, sales or service facilities.** (such as a docking or port facility necessary for the loading and unloading of cargo or passengers, shipbuilding, ship repair or seafood processing facilities. The term does not include long-term storage, manufacture, sales or service facilities.)

"Historic Structure" means any structure that is: (a) Listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of the Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as meeting the requirements for individual listing in the National Register; (b) Certified or registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district; (c) Individually listed on a state inventory of historic places in states with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or (d) Individually listed on a local inventory of historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either: (1) By an approved state program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior or (2) Directly by the Secretary of the Interior in states without approved programs.

"Lowest floor" means the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basement). An unfinished or flood-resistant enclosure, usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage, in an area other than a basement area, is not considered a building's lowest floor.

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"Manufactured home" means a structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities. The term also includes recreational vehicles placed on a site for one hundred eighty (180) consecutive days or longer and intended to be improved property.

"Manufactured home park or subdivision" means a parcel, or contiguous parcels, of land divided into two or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

"Mean sea level" means, for purposes of the National Flood Insurance Program, the North American Vertical Datum (NAVD) of 1988 (~~the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929,~~) or other datum to which base flood elevations shown on a community's Flood Insurance Rate Map are referenced.

"Market Value" means the market value of the structure shall be determined by the property's tax assessment, minus the land value prior to the start of the initial repair or improvement, or in the case of damage, the value of the structure prior to the damage occurring.

"New manufactured home park or subdivision" means a manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, as a minimum, the installation utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date, October 15, 1980, of the floodplain management ordinance adopted by the community.

"National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD)" as corrected in 1929, means a vertical control used as a reference for establishing varying elevations within the floodplain.

"New construction" means structures for which the "start of construction" commenced on or after the effective date of the initial Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM),



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(October 15, 1980), and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.

"Recreational vehicle" (A.K.K. park trailers, travel trailers and similar transportable structures) means a vehicle which is:

1. Built on a single chassis;
2. Four hundred (400) square feet or less when measured at the longest horizontal projections;
3. Designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; and
4. Designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling, but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel or seasonal use.

"Sand dunes" means naturally occurring accumulations of sand in ridges or mounds landward of the beach.

"Start of construction" (for other than new construction or substantial improvements under the coastal barrier resources act (P.L. 97-348)), includes substantial improvement, and means the date the building permit was issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction or improvement was within one hundred eighty (180) days of the permit date. The actual start means the first placement of permanent construction of a structure (including a manufactured home) on a site, such as the pouring of slabs or footings, installation of piles, construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation or placement of a manufactured home on a foundation. Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling; nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways; nor does it include excavation for a basement, footings, piers or foundations or the erection of temporary forms; nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial improvement, the actual start of construction means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

"Structure" means walled and roofed building that is principally above ground, a

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manufactured home, a gas or liquid storage tank, or other manmade facilities or infrastructures.

"Substantial damage" means damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to its before-damaged condition would equal or exceed fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

"Substantial improvement" means any combination of repair, reconstruction or improvement of a structure taking place during a one-year period in which the cumulative cost equals or exceeds fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure either:

1. Before the improvement or repair is started, or
2. If the structure has been damaged and is being restored, before the damage occurred. For the purposes of this definition, substantial improvement is considered to occur when the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor or other structural part of the building commences, whether or not the alteration affects the external dimensions of the structure.

The term does not, however, include either:

1. Any project for improvement of a structure to comply with existing state or local health, sanitary or safety code specifications which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions, or
2. Any alteration of a structure listed on the National Register of Historic Places or a State Inventory of Historic Places.

"Variance" means a grant of relief from the requirements of this chapter which permits construction in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this chapter where specific enforcement would result in unnecessary hardship.

"Violation" means the failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with the community's floodplain management regulations. A structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided.

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"Water surface elevation" means the height, in relation to the North American Vertical Datum (NAVD) of 1988 (~~the National Geodetic Vertical Datum (NGVD) of 1929,~~), (or other datum where specified) of floods of various magnitudes and frequencies in the floodplains of coastal or riverine areas.

15.44.050 Lands to which this chapter applies.

This chapter shall apply to all areas of special flood within the jurisdiction of the Bridgeport flood and erosion control board.

15.44.060 Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard.

The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency(FEMA) in its Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for Fairfield County, Connecticut, Dated June 18, 2010, and the accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM), dated June 18, 2010, and other supporting data applicable to the City of Bridgeport, and any subsequent revisions thereto, are adopted by reference and declared to be part of this chapter. Since mapping is legally adopted by reference into this chapter it must take precedence when more restrictive until such time as a map amendment or map revision is obtained from FEMA. The area of special flood hazard includes any area shown on the FIRM as Zones A, AE and VE, including areas designated as a floodway on a FIRM. Zone VE is also identified as a Coastal High Hazard Area. Areas of special flood hazard are determined utilizing the base flood elevations (BFE) provided on flood profiles in the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for a community. BFEs provided on a Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) are only approximate (rounded up or down) and should be verified with the BFEs published in the FIS for the specific location. The FIS and FIRM are on file in the City Engineer's office, Room 216, City Hall, 45 Lyon Terrace, Bridgeport, Connecticut.

~~(The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal Insurance Administration in a scientific and engineering report entitled "The Flood Insurance Study for the City of Bridgeport," dated September 6, 1989 and as revised, with accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps, latest revision June 16, 1992 and as revised, is adopted by~~



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~~reference and declared to be a part of this chapter. The Flood Insurance Study Flood Boundary and Floodway maps and FIRM maps are on file in the city engineer's office, City Hall, 45 Lyon Terrace, Bridgeport, Connecticut.~~

15.44.070 Compliance with chapter.

No structure or land shall hereafter be constructed, located, extended, converted or altered without full compliance with the terms of this chapter and other applicable regulations.

15.44.080 Abrogation and greater restrictions.

This chapter is not intended to repeal, abrogate or impair any existing easements, covenants or deed restrictions. However, where this chapter and another ordinance, easement, covenant or deed restriction conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent restrictions shall prevail.

15.44.090 Interpretation of chapter.

In the interpretation and application of this chapter, all provisions shall be:

1. Considered as minimum requirements;
2. Liberally construed in favor of the governing body; and
3. Deemed neither to limit nor repeal any other powers granted under state statutes.

15.44.100 Warning and disclaimer of liability.

The degree of flood protection required by this chapter is considered reasonable



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for regulatory purposes and is based on scientific and engineering consideration. Larger floods can and will occur on rare occasions. Flood heights may be increased by manmade or natural causes. This chapter does not imply that land outside the areas of special flood hazards, or uses permitted within such areas, will be free from flooding or flood damages. This chapter shall not create liability on the part of the city, any officer or employee thereof or the Federal Insurance Administration, for any flood damages that result from reliance on this chapter or any administrative decision lawfully made thereunder.

15.44.110 Establishment of permit.

- A. Prior to the issuance of a building permit within any area of a special hazard established in Section 15.44.060, a site plan shall be furnished by the applicant, and may include, but not be limited to, the nature, location, dimension and elevations of the area in question, existing and proposed grades, existing or proposed structures and drainage facilities. If the city engineer requires a proposed grading plan or drainage facilities, this site plan shall be prepared by a licensed professional engineer. Specifically the following information is required:
1. Elevation in relation to mean sea level, of the lowest floor (including basement) of all structures;
 2. Elevation in relation to mean sea level to which any structure is to be floodproofed;
 3. Certification by a registered professional engineer or architect that the floodproofing methods for any nonresidential structure meet the floodproofing criteria in Section 15.44.150(B)(2);
 4. Description of the extent to which any watercourse will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed development.
- B. Prior to the start of any development which does not require the issuance of a building permit, within any area of special flood hazard established in Section 15.44.060, a development permit shall be obtained. Application for a development permit shall be made to the city engineer and shall include, but not



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be limited to, the same information as required for a building permit in a flood hazard zone.

C. Construction Stage. Upon completion of the applicable portion of construction, the applicant shall provide verification to the Bridgeport building official of the following as is applicable:

1. Lowest floor elevation--the elevation to be verified for:
 - a. For structures in Zone A and AE, (~~Zones A, A1-A30, AE,~~) provide the as-built elevation of the top of the lowest floor, including basement;
 - b. For nonresidential structures in Zone A and AE, (~~Zones A, A1-A30, AE,~~) provide the as-built elevation to which the floodproofing is effective;
 - c. For structures in the VE Zone (~~V1-V30 and VE zones~~), provide the as-built elevation of the bottom of the lowest horizontal structural member of the elevated building excluding pilings or columns.

D. Deficiencies detected by the review of the site plan referred to in this section shall be corrected by the permit holder immediately and prior to further progressive work being permitted to proceed. Failure to submit the survey or failure to make said corrections required by this chapter shall be cause to issue a stop-work order for the project.

15.44.120 Designation of the city engineer.

The city engineer is appointed to administer and implement this chapter by granting or denying building and development permit applications in accordance with its provisions.

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15.44.130 Duties and responsibilities of the city engineer.

Duties of the city engineer shall include, but not be limited to:

A. Permit Review.

1. Review all building or development permit applications to determine that the permit requirements of this chapter have been satisfied **and all proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding;**
2. Review all building or development permit applications to determine that all necessary permits have been obtained from those federal, state or local governmental agencies from which prior approval is required;
3. Review all building or development permit applications for sufficiency in information in the area of special flood hazard except in the coastal high hazard area to verify that the proposed development is not proposed to adversely affect the flood carrying capacity of the area of special flood hazard. For the purposes of this chapter, "adversely affect" means that the cumulative effect of the proposed development, when combined with all other existing and anticipated development will increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than one foot at any time, which is not allowable;
4. Review building or development permit applications in the coastal high hazard area of the area of special flood hazard to determine if the proposed development would unacceptably alter sand dunes so as to increase potential flood damages and therefore, require that the site plan be revised;
5. Review plans for walls to be use to enclose space below the base flood level in accordance with Section 15.44.150.



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- B. Use of Other Base Flood Data. When base flood elevations data or floodway data have not been provided in accordance with Section 15.44.060, basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard, the city engineer shall obtain, review and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation data and floodway data available from a federal, state or other source, in order to administer Section 15.44.150.
- C. Information to be obtained and maintained by the city engineer:
1. Obtain a certificate by a licensed land surveyor of the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the top of the lowest floor (including basement) of a structure in a numbered A zone of all new or substantially improved structures and record. Also, the lowest point of the lowest structural member (excluding piling or columns of a structure in the V zone) shall be recorded;
 2. For all new or substantially improved floodproofed structures:
 - a. Verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level), and
 - b. Maintain the floodproofing certifications required in Section 15.44.150(B)(3)(c);
 3. In coastal high hazard areas, certification shall be obtained from a registered professional engineer or architect that the structure is securely anchored to adequately anchored pilings or columns in order to withstand velocity waters in hurricane wave wash;
 4. Maintain for public inspection all records pertaining to the provisions of this chapter.
- D. Alteration of Watercourse.
1. Review any request to alter a watercourse so that the flood carrying capacity is not diminished. City engineer may require that the site plan be revised if an unacceptable alteration of a watercourse is noted;
 2. Require that maintenance is provided by the owner of the property within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so that



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the flood carrying capacity is not diminished;

3. Notify neighboring communities and the Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection of watercourse alterations.

E. Interpretation of FIRM Boundaries.

1. Make interpretations of regulatory related situations.

15.44.140 Variance procedure.

A. Appeal Board.

1. The zoning board of appeals as established by the city council shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the requirements of this chapter.
2. The zoning board of appeals shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged there is an error in any requirement, decision or determination made by the city engineer in the enforcement or administration of this chapter.
3. Those aggrieved by the decision of the zoning board of appeals may appeal within fifteen (15) days after such decision to the superior court, as provided in Section 8-7 of Chapter 124, Connecticut General Statutes.
4. In passing upon such application the zoning board of appeals shall consider all technical evaluations, all relevant factors, standards specified in other sections of this chapter, and
 - a. The danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
 - b. The danger to life and property due to flooding or erosion damage;
 - c. The susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner;
 - d. The importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to



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- the community;
- e. The necessity of the facility to a waterfront location, in the case of a functionally dependent facility;
 - f. The availability of alternative locations for proposed use which are not subject to flooding or erosion damage;
 - g. The compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development;
 - h. The relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and flood plan management program of that area;
 - i. The safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;
 - j. The expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise and sediment transport of the floodwaters and the effects of wave action, if applicable, expected at the site; and
 - k. The costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical and water systems and streets and bridges.
5. Generally, variances may be issued for new construction and substantial improvements to be erected on a lot of one-half acre or less in size contiguous to and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood level, providing items listed in subsection (A)(4)(a) through (k) of this section have been fully considered. As the lot size increases beyond the one-half acre, the technical justification required for issuing the variance increases.
 6. Upon consideration of the factors listed in subsection (A)(4)(a) through (k) of this section and the purposes of this chapter, the zoning board of appeals may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this chapter.
 7. The city engineer shall maintain the records of all appeal actions and report any variances to the Federal Insurance Administration upon request.



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B. Conditions for Variances.

1. Variances may be issued for the reconstruction, rehabilitation or restoration of structures listed on the National Register of Historic Places, with regard to the procedures set forth in the remainder of this section.
2. Variances shall not be issued within any designated floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge would result.
3. Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard to afford relief.
4. Variances shall only be issued upon:
 - a. A showing of good and sufficient cause;
 - b. A determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant; and
 - c. A determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of public as identified in subsection (A)(4) of this section, or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances.
5. Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with a lowest floor elevation below the base flood elevation and that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation up to amounts as high as twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of insurance coverage.

15.44.150 Provisions for flood hazard reduction.

A. General Standards. In all areas of special flood hazards the following standards are required:

1. Anchoring.
 - a. All new construction and substantial improvements shall be



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anchored to prevent flotation, collapse or lateral movement of the structure **resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy.**

2. Construction Material and Methods.
 - a. All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials resistant to flood damage;
 - b. All new construction and substantial improvements shall be **constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damages** (~~constructed with materials resistant to flood damage.~~)
3. Utilities.
 - a. Electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, air conditioning equipment and other service facilities shall be designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding;
 - b. All new and replacement water supply systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system;
 - c. New and replacement sanitary sewerage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of floodwaters into the systems and discharge from the systems into floodwaters; and
 - d. On-site waste disposal systems shall be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding.
4. Subdivision Proposals.
 - a. All subdivision proposals shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage;
 - b. All subdivision proposals shall have public utilities and facilities such as a sewer, gas, electrical and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage;
 - c. All subdivision proposals shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and
 - d. Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision



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proposals and other proposed development which contain at least fifty (50) lots or five acres (whichever is less).

5. Manufactured Homes.
 - a. All manufactured homes (including recreational vehicles placed on a site for one hundred eighty (180) consecutive days or longer) to be placed, or substantially improved, shall be installed using methods and practices which minimize flood damage. They shall also be elevated and anchored to resist flotation, collapse and lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties;
 - b. Elevation construction standards include piling foundations placed no more than ten feet apart, and reinforcement is provided for piers more than six feet above ground level.
- B. Specific Standards. In all areas of special flood hazards where base flood elevation data has been provided as set forth in Section 15.44.060, basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard or in Section 15.44.030(B). Use of other base flood data, the following standards are required:
 1. Residential Construction.
 - a. New construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure shall have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to or above base flood elevation.
 2. Manufactured Homes in Zone A and AE.
 - a. All manufactured homes (including recreational vehicles placed on a site for one hundred eighty (180) consecutive days or longer) to be placed, or substantially improved, shall be elevated so that the lowest floor is above the base flood elevation. This includes manufactured homes located outside a manufactured home park or subdivision, in a new manufactured home park or subdivision, in an expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision, or on a site in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision in which a manufactured home has incurred substantial damage as a result of a flood;



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- b. It shall be placed on a permanent foundation which itself is securely anchored and to which the structure is securely anchored so that it will resist flotation, lateral movement and hydrostatic and hydrodynamic pressures. Anchoring may include, but not be limited to, the use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors;
 - c. It shall be installed using methods and practices which minimize flood damage;
 - d. Adequate access and drainage should be provided.
 - e. **Recreational vehicles shall either be on site for fewer than 180 consecutive days, and be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or meet all the general standards of section 15.44.150 A., and the elevation and anchoring requirement of section 15.44.150 A. 5. a and b., and 15.44.150 b. 2. a., b., c. and d. for a manufactured home. A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.**
3. Nonresidential Construction. New construction and substantial improvement of any commercial, industrial or other nonresidential structure shall either have the lowest floor, including basement, elevated to the level of the base flood elevation; or, together with attendant utility and sanitary facilities, shall:
- a. Be floodproofed so that below an elevation of one foot above the base flood level the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water;
 - b. Have structural components capable of resisting hydrostatic and hydronamic loads and effects of buoyancy; and
 - c. Be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect that the design and methods of construction are in accordance with acceptable standards of practice for meeting the provisions of this subsection. Such certifications shall be provided to the official as set forth in Section 15.44.130(c)(2).



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4. Enclosed Areas Below Base Flood Elevation— **A and AE Zones.**(A1-A30 Zones). New construction, or substantial improvements, of elevated buildings that include fully enclosed areas formed by foundation and other exterior walls below the base flood elevation shall be designed to preclude finished living space and designed to allow for the entry and exit of floodwaters to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls.
 - a. Designs for complying with this requirement must either be certified by a professional engineer or architect, or meet the following minimum criteria:
 - i. Provide a minimum of two openings having a total net area of not less than one square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding;
 - ii. The bottom of all openings shall be no higher than one foot above grade; and
 - iii. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, valves or other coverings or devices provided they permit the automatic flow of floodwater in both directions.
 - b. Electrical, plumbing and other utility connections are prohibited below the base flood elevation;
 - c. Access to the enclosed area shall be the minimum necessary to allow for parking of vehicles (garage door) or limited storage of maintenance equipment used in connection with the premises (standard exterior door) or entry to the living area (stairway or elevator); and
- C. Coastal High Hazard Area. Coastal high hazard areas (**VE** zones) are located within the areas of special flood hazard established in Section 15.44.060. These areas have special flood hazards associated with high velocity waters from tidal surges and hurricane wave wash; therefore, the following provisions shall apply:
 1. Location of Structures.
 - a. All new buildings, structures or substantial improvements shall be located landward of reach of the mean high tide.



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2. Construction Methods.

- a. Elevation. All new buildings, structures or substantial improvements shall be elevated so that the lowest supporting member (excluding pilings or columns) is located no lower than the base flood elevation level, with all space below the lowest supporting member open so as not to impede the flow of water, except for breakaway walls as provided for in subsection 15.44.150(C)(2)(d) of this section.
- b. Structural Support.
 - i. All new buildings, structures or substantial improvements shall be securely anchored on pilings or columns.
 - ii. All pilings and columns and the attached structures shall be anchored to resist flotation, collapse and lateral movement due to the effect of wind and water loads acting simultaneously on all building components. The anchoring and support system shall be designed with wind and water loading values which equal or exceed the one-hundred-year mean recurrence interval (one percent annual chance floods and winds).
 - iii. There shall be no fill used for structural support.
- c. Certification. Compliance with the provisions of subsection(C)(2)(a) and (b) of this section shall be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect including design specifications and plans for construction.
- d. Space Below the Lowest Floor.
 - i. Any alteration, repair, reconstruction or improvement to a structure started after the enactment of the ordinance codified in this chapter shall not enclose the space below the lowest floor unless breakaway walls are used as provided for in this section.
 - ii. Nonsupporting breakaway wall, lattice work or mesh screening shall be allowed below the base flood elevation



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provided they are not a part of the structural support of the building and are designed so as to break away, under abnormally high tides or wave action, without damage to the structural integrity of the building on which they are to be used and provided the following design specifications are met:

- (A) Design-safe loading resistance of each wall shall not be less than ten nor more than twenty (20) pounds per square foot; or
 - (B) If more than twenty (20) pounds per square foot, a registered professional engineer or architect shall certify that the design wall collapse would result from a water load less than that which would occur during the base flood event, and the elevated portion of the building and supporting foundation system shall not be subject to collapse, displacement or other structural damage due to the effects of wind and water loads acting simultaneously on all building components during the base flood event. Maximum wind and water loading values to be used in this determination shall each have one percent chance of being equalled or exceeded in any given year (one- hundred-year mean recurrence interval).
- iii. If breakaway walls are utilized, such enclosed space shall not be used for human habitation, but shall be designed to be used only for parking of vehicles, building access or limited storage of maintenance equipment used in connection with the premises.
 - iv. Prior to construction, plans for any structure that will have breakaway walls must be submitted to the city engineer for approval.
 - v. Any alteration, repair, reconstruction or improvement to a structure shall not enclose the space below the lowest floor except with breakaway walls, lattice work or screening as



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provided in subsection (C)(2)(d)(ii)((A) and ((B)) of this section.

3. Manufactured Homes in VE Zones.

- a. All manufactured homes (including recreational vehicles placed on a site for one hundred eighty (180) consecutive days or longer) to be placed, or substantially improved, shall be elevated so that the lowest structural member (lowest floor) is above the base flood elevation and meet the construction requirements of section 15.44.15 C. 1. and 2. This includes manufactured homes located outside a manufactured home park or subdivision, in an existing manufactured home park or subdivision, in a new manufactured home park or subdivision, in an expansion to an existing manufactured home park or subdivision, or on a site in an existing manufactured home park in which a manufactured home has incurred substantial damage as a result of a flood;
- b. It shall be placed on a permanent foundation which itself is securely anchored and to which the structure is securely anchored so that it will resist flotation, lateral movement and hydrostatic and hydrodynamic pressures. Anchoring may include, but not be limited to, the use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors;
- c. It shall be installed using methods and practices which minimize flood damage;
- d. Adequate access and drainage should be provided.
- e. Recreational vehicles shall either be on site for fewer than 180 consecutive days, and be fully licensed and ready for highway use, or meet all the general standards of section 15.44.150 A., and the elevation and anchoring requirement of section 15.44.150 A. 5. a and b., and 15.44.150 b. 2. a., b., c. and d. for a manufactured home. A recreational vehicle is ready for highway use if it is on its wheels or jacking system, is attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities and security devices, and has no permanently attached additions.



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4. Sand Dunes. There shall be no alteration of sand dunes which would increase potential flood damage.

D. Floodways. Located within areas of special flood hazard established in Section 15.44.060 are areas designated under Section 15.44.130(B) as floodways. Since the floodway is an extremely hazardous area due to the velocity of flood waters which carry debris, potential projectiles and erosion potential, the following provisions apply:

1. Encroachments. Prohibit encroachments including fill, new construction, substantial improvements and other development unless certification, with a supporting technical data, by a registered professional engineer (or architect) is provided demonstrating, through hydrologic and hydraulic analyses performed in accordance with standard engineering practice, that encroachments shall not result in any (0.00) increase in flood levels during the occurrence of the base flood discharge.
2. In A zones where base flood elevations have been determined, but before a floodway is designated, no new construction, substantial improvement or other development (including fill) shall be permitted which will increase base flood elevations more than one foot at any point along the watercourse when all anticipate development is considered cumulatively with the proposed development.
3. The city may request floodway data of an applicant for watercourses without FEMA-published floodways. When such data is provided by an applicant or whenever such data is available from any other source (in response to the city's request or not), the city shall adopt a regulatory floodway based on the principle that the floodway must be able to convey the waters of the base flood without increasing the water surface elevation more than one foot at any point along the watercourse.

E. Equal Conveyance. Within the floodplain, except in those areas which are tidally influenced, as designated on the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) for the community, encroachments resulting from filling, new construction or substantial improvements involving an increase in footprint of the structure, are prohibited unless the



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applicant provides certification by a registered professional engineer demonstrating, with supporting hydrologic and hydraulic analyses performed in accordance with standard engineering practice, that such encroachments shall not result in any (0.00 feet) increase in flood levels (base flood elevation). Work within the floodplain and the land adjacent to the floodplain, including work to provide compensatory storage shall not be constructed in such a way to cause an increase in flood stage or flood velocity.

- F. Compensatory Storage. The water holding capacity of the floodplain, except those areas which are tidally influenced, shall not be reduced. Any reduction caused by filling, new construction or substantial improvements involving an increase in footprint to a structure, shall be compensated for by deepening and/or widening of the floodplain. Storage shall be provided on site, unless easements have been gained from adjacent property owners; it shall be provided within the same hydraulic reach and a volume not previously used for flood storage; it shall be hydraulically comparable and incrementally equal to the theoretical volume of flood water at each elevation, up to and including 100-year flood elevation, which would be displaced by the proposed project. Such compensatory volume shall have an unrestricted hydraulic connection to the same waterway or water body. Compensatory storage can be provided off-site if approved by the municipality.
- G. Aboveground Storage Tanks. Aboveground storage tanks (oil, propane, etc) which are located outside or inside of a structure must either be elevated above the base flood elevation (BFE) on a concrete pad, or be securely anchored with tie down straps to prevent flotation or lateral movement, have the top of the fill pipe extended above the BFE, and have a screw cap that does not allow for the infiltration of flood water.
- H. Portion of Structure in a Flood Zone. If any portion of a structure lies within the Special Flood hazard Area (SFHA), the entire structure is



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considered to be in the SFHA. The entire structure must meet the requirements of the flood zone. This includes any additions made to the main structure.

- I. No Structures Entirely or Partially Over Water. New construction, substantial improvement and repair to structure that have sustained damage cannot be constructed or located entirely or partially over water unless it is a functionally dependent use or facility.

The Committee on **Ordinances** begs leave to report; and recommends for adoption the following resolution:

BE IT ORDAINED: By the City Council of the City of Bridgeport that the Bridgeport Municipal Code is hereby amended to include the following new Chapter 8.97 – South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone.

8.97.010 Declaration of Policy

8.97.010 Declaration of Policy

It is found and declared that there exists within the South End neighborhood a significant number of deteriorated property and property that has been foreclosed, is abandoned, blighted, or is substandard or poses a hazard to public safety, and that the existence of such deteriorated, foreclosed, abandoned, blighted, substandard, and hazardous property contributes to the decline of the South End neighborhood. Connecticut General Statute Chapter 118 provides for municipalities to establish a Neighborhood Revitalization Zone to address these issues.

The South End neighborhood has followed the State Statute and has adopted a South End Revitalization Zone Plan. Per Connecticut General Statute Chapter 118, and adopted City Council Resolution 111-95, the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Plan shall be implemented and is hereby recognized.



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8.97.020 Definitions

For the purpose of this chapter, the following words and terms shall have the meanings respectively ascribed as follows:

"South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone" refers to the boundaries approved by the City Council on October 6, 2008, and as set forth in this chapter in Section 8.79.050 of this chapter.

"South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Implementation Committee" refers to the legal entity under which The Plan will be implemented and amended as necessary.

"South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Plan" refers to the planning document adopted by the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Planning Committee, South End Community and City Council. Also referred to as "The Plan."

"Implementation Committee" refers to the permanent committee of the South End Revitalization Zone, authorized by this chapter that is committed to implementing The South End Strategic Plan.

"Neighborhood Revitalization Zone" refers to a mechanism devised by the State of Connecticut under which the community and government work collaboratively to revitalize neighborhoods. Also referred to as NRZ.

"The Plan" refers to the planning document formally known as the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Plan and approved by the City Council as this chapter, in accordance with Section 7-601(d) of the General Statutes of Connecticut. (Ord. dated 11/6/06 (part)).

8.97.030 Authority to Implement the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Plan

The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone bylaws are incorporated as an appendix within the approved Plan, and said organization was the entity under which The Plan was created. The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone shall be the responsible entity to implement The Plan.



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It is expected the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone will need the assistance of various City agencies or departments to implement certain aspects of The Plan, and the City shall provide appropriate assistance as necessary.

The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone, through the Implementation Committee, shall abide by the Connecticut General Statutes reporting requirements for NRZ's.

8.97.040 Implementation Committee

The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone shall establish a permanent committee, which is committed to the implementation of The Plan. Such committee shall be representative of the South End neighborhood and include City of Bridgeport representative. Constituencies represented on the Planning Committee of The Plan shall also be represented in the Implementation Committee.

Such Implementation Committee shall abide by the by-laws of the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone, but also incorporate the community to the greatest extent possible.

8.97.050 Boundaries of South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone

The following are the boundaries of the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone, as adopted by the City Council on October 6, 2008:

Beginning at the junction of State Street and Norman Street travel four blocks to West Avenue then: one lot east passed West Avenue to Block 0953 then: travel South along the eastern side of Block 0953 to the corner of Prospect Street and Myrtle Avenue then: arc easterly across the southwestern portion of the adjacent State-owned interstate exchange (Route 8 and I-95) then: across South Avenue to Interstate I-95 then: travel northeast along the centerline of I-95 to the Amtrak rail corridor and east to Bridgeport Harbor then: proceed southeast along the



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shoreline of Bridgeport Harbor then: travel west along the shoreline of Seaside Park to the southern most tip of Seaside Beach on Long Island Sound at Fayerweather Island then: travel north and north east along the mid-channel centerline of Black Rock Harbor and then mid-channel along the western branch of Cedar Creek then: travel north bisecting Block 0139, pass under Interstate I-95 and continue to Railroad Avenue then travel east on Railroad Avenue to the corner of Norman Street then: travel north on Norman Street to the junction of State Street.

8.97.060 Authority to Amend the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Plan

As necessary, the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone shall amend The Plan. Such amendments to The Plan shall be approved by the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Implementation Committee and City Council.

8.97.070 Authority to Comment on Zoning Applications

The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone shall receive copies of the legal notices and agendas for all zoning board meetings. These copies shall be sent by the zoning office in a timely fashion so as to allow the NRZ adequate time to review the application within the zoning office prior to the publicized meeting.

The South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone has the authority to submit written comments to the applicable zoning board for any zoning application that is within the NRZ boundaries. These written comments shall be based upon the adherences of the zoning application to the South End Neighborhood Revitalization Zone Plan. The zoning boards must consider these written comments during the course of their deliberations on the application.

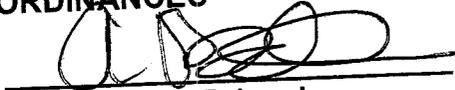


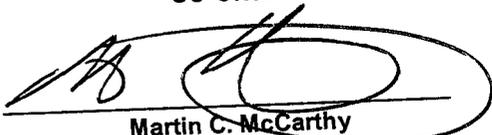
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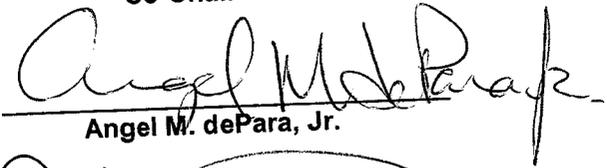
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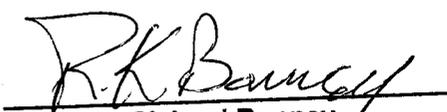
