MEMORANDUM

TO: Airport Tenants and Users in North Apron and T-Hangar Area

RE: Vehicle Access and Parking in North Apron and T-Hangar Area

New procedures are in effect for vehicle access and parking in the North Apron and T-Hangar Area. Tenants approved for access shall use the following procedure upon entering the airport:

1. Scan through the Atlantic vehicle gate using your airport-issued ID badge, pull through and wait for the gate to fully close behind you;
2. Turn right and travel towards Main St.;
3. Turn left by the back fence and travel NW along Main St.;
4. Turn left after Atlantic's last hangar;
5. Park vehicles in a newly designated parking area adjacent to the first row of T-Hangars and walk through the opening in the new fence to access your aircraft.

The procedure shall be reversed for individuals leaving the airport. Lines for vehicle spaces will be painted in the new tenant parking area when the weather cooperates. Badge access to the Atlantic gate will be restored one by one to the appropriate users starting on Wednesday, April 1st. Individuals who have a problem with their access badge after this date should contact Airport Operations at 203-576-7497.

While on the Air Operations Area (AOA) vehicle operators shall also comply with the following:

- Obey all traffic signs.
- Comply with published speed limits. Unless otherwise depicted, the speed limit in aircraft parking areas is normally 5 m.p.h. and the speed limit in other areas of the AOA is normally 10-15 m.p.h.
- Yield to all aircraft (including aircraft under tow), pedestrians, and/or individuals operating aircraft support equipment.
- If unsure of proper procedures, STOP!!! Seek help from an airport employee or call Airport Operations (203-576-7497).

This procedure is in effect until further notice. The Airport is considering new and/or improved processes for airport access/vehicle management and security. We will be in touch with any pertinent changes in the future.
