Ms. Foster read a statement regarding the issue about the adult entertainment ordinance and the strong support it has received. She expressed that she has been aware of the negative impact and sex related crimes that are associated with adult entertainment establishments that affect businesses, schools and religious institutions. She further expressed that these types of establishments cause parking problems on residential property and she stressed that the ordinance will protect the health, safety and welfare of neighborhoods. She read some information related to the regulations and she emphasized that the residents don't want to see any expansion of this industry in their neighborhoods. She relayed that regarding liquor permit requests, she said she planned to file a complaint

on Tuesday indicating her opposition to issuing permits – *she submitted her statement to the city clerk.*

People with Disabilities Update

Mr. Robinson stated that he was there to give an update on the matter concerning people with disabilities. He said he spoke to Linda Gray, who informed him that other names would be submitted pertaining to a proposal for an equal democratic ratio as it applies to people with disabilities.

Mr. Robinson read and presented Tom White with a proclamation recognizing him for his involvement with the “People with Disabilities” program in the Greater Bridgeport area.

Tom White stated that he passed along the information for support of the “People with Disabilities Act”. He expressed that the matter also had the support of the city council.

Camilla Cosme

Police Brutality

Ms. Cosme spoke about police brutality. She recalled an incident that occurred on June 16 or June 17 that involved her nephew and Officer Diaz. She alleged that Officer Diaz harassed her nephew about selling drugs. The police officer came out to investigate the matter and she said he was very rude and made a statement that *“people in the projects should be dealt with like a bunch of animals”*. She requested assistance from the city council to investigate the actions of the police officer and seek justice for her nephew. She expressed that her family has never had any problems with the police throughout the years they’ve lived in Bridgeport.

Council President McCarthy suggested that she complete a Citizen’s Complaint form as the best avenue to submit the complaint to the Office of Internal Affairs.

Ms. Cosme thanked the council members that extended their support in this matter.

Charles Coviello

Education

Mr. Coviello spoke about the city being in an education crisis. He asked the city council to make sure that the education system remains vital, to provide an equal education for the students in Bridgeport. He thanked Council members Holloway, Baker and dePara for showing their interest in the education of the children and he emphasized that they need to show unity and do away with the disparity in the education system. He relayed that the

state is responsible for providing equal education. He encouraged everyone to attend and join in unity night on Tuesday to fight for education for the good of our children.

2) Council member Baker stated the second item pertained to the explanation key for reading the data that will be added to the summary report.

3) Council member Baker stated the third item needed to be approved by July 1. He explained that map won't actually become official until the year 2012. The document reads that the effective date of the redistricting isn't applicable until January 1, 2012; however, it won't affect any elections that occur during the 2011 year. And it will be in accordance with the charter.

Council member Walsh stated his concern that the State of Connecticut was remiss doing their work; per the charter that outlines that the city will take into consideration, the state lines set forth. His concern was that there are a significant number of voters that get bumped from one place to another based on the election. He recalled past incidences of people getting sent to the wrong school to vote and the problem of insufficient ballots. He stressed that the city should question if there is any method to amend the ordinance should anything go wrong in the future.

Council President McCarthy said he wasn't sure about what Council member Walsh asked. He explained that they tried to change the policy by hiring the same expert the state uses, Kim Brace of Election Data Services to coordinate what was being done with the state lines. He further noted that a second round will come up in the near future, to try to coordinate the polling sites, which will alleviate some of the problems.

City Attorney Anastasi added that Chapter 5, Section 2-C of the charter – *as read*; doesn't allow what Council member Walsh requested. He stated that it suggests a ten year proposition as it's outlined in the charter. And that it should follow the state, rather than precede the state.

Council member Walsh said he felt that the state gets a lot more picky when they are drawing the district lines. City Attorney Anastasi said although it's a year late, they never conceded, both parties approved the same plan and they came together at the end.

Council member Holloway stated that the state representative for this district represents a portion of the district. He relayed that there needed to be a clear measure of where a person votes on all levels.

Council member Brantley stated that she would like to see more cooperation between the Registrar of Voters and the council district representatives.

Council President agreed with Council member Brantley. He said he was told that the Registrar of Voters was looking to work cooperatively with the council district representatives.

Council member Martinez also agreed that they needed to send a clear message to the constituents about where a person is supposed to go to vote.

Council member McCarthy stated that the entire redistricting process wasn't easy, but it was done effectively and thoroughly by holding multiple public hearings and meetings.

He thanked Council members Martinez and Holloway for chairing the Redistricting Committee meetings and Council members Baker and Paoletto for chairing the Ordinance

Committee meetings. He expressed that he was proud of all the work that was done to make the drastic changes effective.

City Attorney Anastasi mentioned Chapter-5, Section 2-D that outlined "*The City Council shall provide suitable polling places and define the boundaries for each polling place*". He stated that with respect to the language outlined, the city council does have the authority.

Council member Walsh questioned the 750,000 gallons of raw sewage that resulted from the sewage line break and who's responsible for the cleanup. He stated that the contract of the State of Connecticut caused the sewage line to break, so he felt it was their responsibility for the person they contracted. City Attorney Anastasi stated that he followed the article in the newspaper and he found there was little doubt that the contractor is responsible. The issue is who is taking control of the clean up between Bridgeport and Trumbull. However, the WPCA will pursue appropriate compensation from whoever was at fault. He said he would follow up with a report on the matter at the next scheduled meeting per Council President McCarthy's request.

**CITY OF BRIDGEPORT
EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT
CHIEF OF POLICE FOR THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT**

This agreement entered into, effective as of the 20th day of December, 2010, by and between the City of Bridgeport, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Connecticut (the "City") and Joseph L. Gaudett, Jr. of 36 Brookwood Drive, Newtown, CT 06470, (the "Chief of Police").

WHEREAS, the City in accordance with the City Charter established a position entitled Chief of Police, the occupant of such position being a full-time regular uniformed member of the Bridgeport Police Department, and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Charter of the City of Bridgeport, the Mayor of the City, Bill Finch, has designated Joseph L. Gaudett, Jr. as his appointee to the position of Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto hereby mutually agree as follows:

ARTICLE I - DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The Chief of Police shall operate and control the Police Department of the City, subject to the ultimate operational control vested in the Mayor by law, and consistent with the duties vested in the City's Board of Police Commissioners ("Board") by law. The Chief of Police shall be the head of the City's Police Department; and subject to the operational control of the Mayor, shall exercise those powers and be responsible for those duties as provided by law. See Bridgeport Charter, Chapter, Chapter 3, Section 1, and Chapter 13, Sections 1 - 5; and Bridgeport Code of Ordinances, Chapter 2.40.

The Chief of Police shall plan, coordinate, and manage the Police Department of the City in the protection of persons and property against crime and vice, the investigation and solution of crimes, and the prevention of crimes and the control of traffic. He shall be responsible to the Mayor, or his

designee, for the competent and effective administration of personnel, financial management of the department and for rendering required reports on Police Department activities to the Mayor and the Board as required and requested. He shall report to the Mayor or the Mayor's designee and shall be responsible to the Mayor for the day-to-day operations of the Police Department. He shall be responsible for implementing policies for the Police Department as determined by the Board and shall apply and interpret such policies independently or with subordinate officers. He shall plan and direct the organization, management, and operations of the Police Department; and will implement training and conduct annual evaluations of the ranks of Captains and above subject to any negotiations with the police union in conjunction with the City's Office of Labor Relations. He issues general and special orders to subordinate officers for execution; and conducts field inspection of personnel, equipment and facilities. He shall appear before the City Council, the Board, public agencies and civic organizations to discuss law enforcement problems and to promote cooperation and good will. He shall attend regular monthly meetings of the Board and such special meetings as the Board may call. He shall report to the Board on police activities at such meetings and cooperate with the Board in the development of policies for the Police Department. He shall determine the budgeting needs of the Police Department, prepare and/or direct the preparation of the budget estimates and direct the administration of departmental expenditures in accordance with budgeting allowances and control overtime spending. He shall promote Community Policing; and shall perform all duties and responsibilities as set forth in the Code of Ordinances and Charter of the City of Bridgeport, Rules and Regulations of the Police Department, state law or as otherwise determined to be necessary for the administration and management of the Police Department. He shall perform such additional duties as the Mayor may properly direct in accordance with Mayoral Charter authority.

ARTICLE II - TERM/COMPENSATION/WORK CONDITIONS

A. The Chief of Police shall perform such services as stated in Article I as Chief of Police for a period of five (5) years commencing on December, 20, 2010, and continuing for five (5) years thereafter as provided for under the terms and conditions of the Charter of the City.

B. The Chief of Police shall be paid at the rate of One Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand, twenty-two Dollars, and sixty-two cents (\$126,022.62) per year, plus any salary increase given to other unaffiliated City employees under Ordinance Section 2.36.010, as his exclusive salary and compensation. There will be no other payments or salary for services provided. During the five (5) year term of employment he shall be entitled to all increases for cost of living as are set forth in City Ordinance Section 2.36.010 and to such other adjustments in salary, within the salary ranges in City Ordinance Section 2.36.010, as the Mayor shall determine, in his discretion, are appropriate.

C. The Chief of Police will work the amount of time required to perform the duties outlined in Article I herein, but not less than forty (40) hours per week, and shall be available on call as needed 24/7.

D. The Chief of Police will not be represented by any collective bargaining organization and is excluded from the terms of the current collective bargaining agreement between the City and Bridgeport Police Local #1159, AFSCME Council #15, AFL-CIO and any successor agreements or any other collective bargaining agreement between the City and any other union.

E. The Chief of Police will receive annually longevity pay at the rate of \$100 per year of service.

F. The Chief shall be entitled to tuition reimbursement for all accredited courses in undergraduate, masters or doctorate programs in Criminal Justice or Political Administration for which

he receives a passing grade, upon receiving the prior written approval of the Mayor or CAO and in such amounts or percentages per course as pre-approved by the Mayor on a case-by-case basis.

ARTICLE III – BENEFITS

The Chief of Police shall during his term of employment receive the following fringe benefits:

A. VACATION - Subject to the needs and normal operation of the Police Department and the direction of the Mayor, the Chief of Police shall receive the following allotment of annual vacations to be effective for the time period of April 1 to March 31 of each year.

1. For each time period, five (5) weeks vacation.
2. The Chief may exercise the option of carrying over only one (1) week of unused vacation time from one vacation year to the next vacation year. In addition to the carry over option set forth above, the Chief may elect to sell up to a maximum of two (2) vacation weeks at the regular weekly compensation. The vacation year is April 1 to March 31 of each year.

B. SICK TIME, PERSONAL TIME, SHORT-TERM/LONG-TERM LEAVE - The Chief of Police shall be eligible for three (3) personal days per year for the period from April 1st to March 31st. Sick leave and short term/long term disability insurance will be provided in accordance with City's Policy on Unaffiliated Employee Sick Leave. A medical certificate, acceptable to the Mayor, may be required for any absence of four (4) days or more.

C. INSURANCES - The City shall provide and pay for medical, dental and vision coverage (health benefits) of the same type as is provided to other unaffiliated employees of the City. In the event that the Chief retires as a member of the Bridgeport Police Pension Agreement, Plan B and consequently becomes entitled to receive retiree health benefits, then the City shall supplement such benefits to the extent necessary that he receive health benefits equal to those received by other City

unaffiliated employees, subject to all applicable premium cost shares, co-pays and deductibles. In addition, the City shall provide group life insurance in the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) for the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police shall contribute for health care costs the same amount as the Mayor shall direct to be paid by other unaffiliated employees of the City.

D. PENSION PLAN - The City shall pay ten percent (10%) of the yearly salary of the Chief of Police to the ICMA Retirement System. The Chief of Police shall be eligible to make such other contributions to the ICMA Retirement Plan as may be consistent with applicable law. In addition, the Chief of Police will be eligible to participate in the City's 457 Deferred Compensation Plan in the same manner as other employees of the City.

It is understood that the Chief of Police upon retirement at the rank of Chief agrees to waive any and all claims he may have for accrued overtime as a Deputy Chief in the Bridgeport Police Department. Further, he agrees to accept the buyout of his accrued vacation and sick time in two equal installments: one in calendar year 2011 and the other in calendar year 2012, waiving all claims for interest.

E. BEREAVEMENT LEAVE - The Chief of Police shall be entitled to leave with pay in the event of a death in the immediate family. Such leave shall start on the date of death and shall continue through and including the day of the funeral, but in no event more than three (3) days. For purposes of this section, "immediate family" shall mean and include the following: Mother, Father, Mother-In-Law, Father-In-Law, Sister, Brother, Spouse, Husband, Child, Grandparents, Grandchildren, Daughter-In-Law and Son-In-Law. In addition, he shall be granted leave with pay of one (1) day to attend the funeral or wake of his Brother-In-Law, Sister-In-Law, Aunt or Uncle.

F. HOLIDAYS - The Chief of Police shall be entitled to the same holidays which are provided to other unaffiliated employees of the City. In the event that the Chief of Police shall be required to work on a holiday due to the demands of his work, he shall be entitled to observe the holiday on

another work day, subject to the approval of such day by the Mayor. Holidays, however, shall not accumulate for purposes of additional compensation.

ARTICLE IV - UNIFORM ALLOWANCE

The Chief of Police shall receive the sum of Nine Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$925.00) as an annual uniform allowance so long as he is in the employment of the City. If Bridgeport Police Local #1159 receives an increase(s) in the uniform allowance, then the Chief of Police shall receive the equivalent increase(s).

The City will provide the Chief of Police with his own foul weather gear of good quality and condition. Such clothing shall consist of a reversible raincoat, one side of which shall be of a bright or luminous color, boots, rubbers and weather- proof hat cover.

ARTICLE V - SAVINGS CLAUSE

If any provision(s) of the contract are found to be invalid, the other provisions shall remain effective and binding upon both the City and Chief of Police.

ARTICLE VI - TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT

The City of Bridgeport may terminate this Agreement and the employment of the Chief of Police in accordance with the provisions of Bridgeport Charter, Chapter 13, Sec. 4(b)(5) and Connecticut General Statutes Section 7-278 "Hearing prior to dismissal of municipal police head. Just cause requirement. Appeal." For purposes of this Agreement and the above statute the Mayor shall be deemed the appointing authority as provided for under the Charter of the City. The Mayor may, but shall not be required to, seek the advice of the Board regarding any termination. The advice of the

Board shall not be binding on the Mayor. Conviction of the Chief of Police of any violation of any criminal statute of any State or of the United States of America shall be considered "just cause for termination" of this Agreement and the employment of the Chief of Police, as shall such other acts and/or omissions as constitute "just cause for termination."

In the event that the Chief of Police chooses to terminate this Agreement, he shall give to the City of Bridgeport not less than one hundred twenty (120) days prior notice of his intent to terminate.

ARTICLE VII- IDEMNIFICATIONS

The City shall indemnify the Chief of Police in accordance with the provisions of Connecticut General §7-101a for any claim, demand or judgment by reason of alleged negligence or for alleged infringement of civil rights, which arise while he is acting within the scope of, and in the discharge of, his duties of employment.

ARTICLE VIII – EVALUATIONS

The Mayor, subject to the advice of the Board, shall review and evaluate the performance of the Chief of Police at least once in advance of the adoption of the annual operating budget for the City. Said review shall be in accordance with specific criteria developed jointly by the parties. The Mayor shall provide the Chief of Police and the Board with a summary written statement of his evaluation, and provide for an adequate opportunity to review and discuss such evaluation with the Mayor and the Board during the evaluation process.

ARTICLE IX – VEHICLE & COMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT

The City will provide the Chief of Police with a vehicle in connection with his duties subject to the provisions of the City's Policy on City Owned Vehicles. It is understood that the Chief's MV will be unmarked and appropriately equipped with police radio, siren and emergency lights for his exclusive use 24 hours per day.

The Chief shall be issued a cellular telephone for his use on police business.

ARTICLE X - OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT

The Chief of Police shall not engage in outside employment without the prior written permission of the Mayor which permission may be revoked by the Mayor at any time. However, any such outside employment, if permitted, shall be limited to conferences, educational seminars or classes and consulting work.

ARTICLE XI-RESIDENCY CLAUSE

The Chief of Police shall establish residency within the City of Bridgeport, and he shall relocate to the City within one (1) year of appointment.

ARTICLE XII- POLICIES, PROCEDURES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Chief of Police shall be subject to, and abide by, all pertinent City and Departmental official policies, procedures, rules, and regulations.

ARTICLE XIII- APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement will be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Connecticut.

EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT
FIRE CHIEF FOR THE CITY OF BRIDGEPORT**

This agreement entered into, effective as of the 24th day of May, 2011, by and between the City of Bridgeport, a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of Connecticut ("City") and Brian P. Rooney of 30 Congress Street, Bridgeport, CT 06604 ("Fire Chief").

WHEREAS, the City in accordance with the City Charter established a position entitled Fire Chief, the occupant of such position being a full-time regular uniformed member of the Bridgeport Fire Department, and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Charter of the City of Bridgeport, Brian Rooney is the incumbent Fire Chief currently serving his initial five (5) year term of office which expires May 24, 2011;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Charter of the City of Bridgeport, Bridgeport Mayor Bill Finch has designated Brian Rooney as his appointee to the position of Fire Chief for a second five (5) year term of office.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto hereby mutually agree as follows:

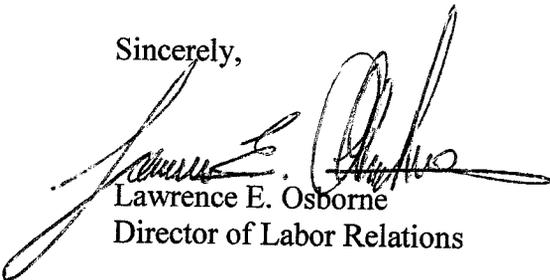

Tentative Agreement
Between
City of Bridgeport
And
AFSCME, Local 1522

1. The City of Bridgeport ("the City of Bridgeport" includes all departments and divisions of the City of Bridgeport including the City of Bridgeport, Board of Education) agrees that there will be no lay-offs of current AFSCME, Local 1522 bargaining unit members from July 1, 2010 through July 1, 2013. This no lay-off language will only apply to current members of AFSCME, Local 1522 who are on the payroll of the City of Bridgeport as of June 10, 2011. Any lay-off notice given to any AFSCME, Local 1522 bargaining unit member between July 1, 2010 to July 1, 2013 shall hereby be rescinded.
2. The provisions in the collective bargaining agreement that apply to retirees, shall be changed to define future retirees as:

Effective July 1, 2011 for purposes of this article "retirees" shall mean employees who: (a) have completed twenty-five (25) years of continuous municipal service regardless of age; and (b) are eligible to receive full pension benefits in accordance with the retirement qualification provisions of MERF Fund B.
3. It is the intent of this provision that all current Union members shall be "grandfathered" under the terms of this new agreement. Any newly hired or promoted employees into the Union shall only receive retiree medical benefits after twenty-five (25) years of service.
4. All current employees as of the date of the execution of this contract shall be eligible for retiree medical benefits if they have attained the following:
 - a) Completed fifteen (15) years of municipal service and are fifty-five (55) or who have completed twenty-five (25) years of municipal service regardless of the age; and
 - b) Are eligible to receive full pension benefits in accordance with the retirement qualification provisions of MERF-Fund B.
5. The parties agree to attach a schedule of existing Union employees who are covered under this Agreement when the collective bargaining agreement is executed.

6. Current bargaining unit members hired prior to July 1, 2011, who are active full time employees of the City of Bridgeport on the date this agreement is signed, will have their PCS contribution capped at twenty-five percent (25%) contribution as of June 30, 2012. This PCS cap is guaranteed to remain intact during the individual employee's employment period and entire period of retirement.

8. Regardless of starting date, any new bargaining unit member hired after July 1, 2011 shall pay a health care premium cost share (PCS) for the above named insurances, which shall be payroll deducted weekly according to the following schedule:

July 1, 2012	25%
July 1, 2013	26%
July 1, 2014	27%
PCS shall increase by 1% per year on July 1 st of each year, until a cap of 50% is reached.	

Said premium contribution shall be the above named amount regardless of the coverage category of: employee only, employee plus one, or employee plus family.

9. Any AFSCME, Local 1522 member who is on payroll of the City of Bridgeport as of 6/10/2011, if eligible for retiree medical benefits, shall have the right to retire at a contribution rate of 12% PCS of the annual cost of health insurance coverage as determined by the City, if they irrevocably retire from their employment with the City of Bridgeport by July 15, 2011.
10. Ten month employees in the City of Bridgeport Board of Education will have their PCS contribution increase to 18% on September 1, 2011 and 25% on July 1, 2012.
11. Fleet Mechanics will receive a one-time addition to their hourly salary of \$1.00/hr. going forward effective July 1, 2011.

12. Every classification in AFSCME, Local 1522 will receive a one-time \$100 increase to the top step of their group classification.
13. The parties agree to negotiate new lay-off and bumping language by October 1, 2011 in accordance to MERA.
14. Review of wage scale as stated in Tentative Agreement from 7/1/2008.

The duration of this contract is from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2014.

This Tentative Agreement agreed to by the bargaining committees' on June 17, 2011.

2.06.010 Districts for election of council members.

A. The Town and City is hereby divided into ten (10) districts for the election of members of the City Council.

1. Each district for the election of members of the City Council shall consist of the residents of the census blocks listed for that district on the attached census block list.

2. The information on the census block list shall be recorded on a census block map and on a street map of the City of Bridgeport.

3. The census block list and maps, both dated 2010 (Plan 3), shall be filed in and available to the public in the office of the City Clerk.

4. In the event of conflict between the maps and the census block list, the census block list shall control.

B. There shall be two (2) members of the City Council elected from each district.

C. This ordinance shall remain in place until a new plan is adopted following the next decennial federal census pursuant to [C.G.S. Sec. 9-169f and the] City Charter, Chapter 5, Section 2, and governing statutory and constitutional provisions [as a result of, or as otherwise required by statute or court order].

D. The plan of districting hereby adopted, and set forth in the attached 2010 (Plan 3) census block list and maps, and the ten (10) districts established herein shall be utilized for the 2012 Bridgeport municipal elections.

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PREAMBLE

This agreement is entered into by the City of Bridgeport, hereinafter referred to as the Employer, and the Bridgeport School Crossing Guards Association, hereinafter referred to as the Association.

ARTICLE I - RECOGNITION

1.1 The Employer recognizes the Association as the sole and exclusive bargaining agent for the purpose of establishing salaries, wages, hours and conditions of employment for all School Crossing Guards employees of the City of Bridgeport.

1.2 The Association recognizes the mayor of the City of Bridgeport or his/her designated representative or representatives as the sole representative of the City of Bridgeport for the purpose of collective bargaining. The Association further agrees to bargain in good faith with the Mayor or his/her designated representative on all matters relating to wages, hours and other conditions of employment.

ARTICLE II - MANAGEMENT RIGHTS

2.1 Except as specifically modified by any provision of this agreement, the City of Bridgeport will continue to have, whether exercised or not, all the rights, power and authority usually vested in management, including but not limited to the following:

- To determine the services of the City;
- To direct its employees; to determine and to manage its business affairs; to determine the employment and structure of its workforce; to determine the technology and the efficiency of its governmental operations and services; and to fulfill all of its legal responsibilities.

ARTICLE III - NONDISCRIMINATION

3.1 There shall be no discrimination against an employee because of his race, color, sex, religious creed, national origin, political or union affiliations.

ARTICLE IV - HOLIDAYS

4.1 All School Crossing Guards shall be paid and have the following days off: Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Day after Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, President's Day, Good Friday, Memorial Day, Martin Luther King Day, and Three Kings Day.

4.2 In addition, effective September 1994, all School Crossing guards with one (1) or more years of service shall be paid and have off Labor Day.

4.3 Except for paid holidays occurring during a school vacation, employees must work the day before and the day after such holiday unless excused on either day for reasons acceptable to the City (For Example: Funeral, Immediate Family, Personal Illness, Illness on a holiday, or Emergency conditions beyond the employee's control) in order to be paid for the holiday.

ARTICLE V - HOURS OF WORK AND OVERTIME

5.1 For all employees covered by this agreement the hours of work will be from 7:30 a.m. to 8:45 a.m.; and 1:45 p.m. to 3:25 p.m. These hours may vary if a Guard covers more than one school, or if individual schools have children coming for breakfast program, or if a school has an opening or closing time different than those listed above.

5.2 As a condition of continued employment, employees will be required to attend a maximum of four (4) hours per year of training which will be scheduled no less than five (5) days, no more than ten (10) days, before the start of the fall semester. The School Crossing Guards will receive one (1) days pay at the applicable rate for attendance.

5.3 All new employees, including any employee hired after a three (3) month break in service, must serve a probationary period of ninety (90) days. During the probationary period, the City has sole and complete discretion to remove any employee for any and all reasons.

ARTICLE VI - WAGES

7.1 Effective September 1, 2011, the daily rate shall be increased by zero percent (0%).

6.2 Effective September 2, 2012, the daily rate shall be increased by zero percent (0%).

6.3 Effective September 1, 2013, the daily rate shall be increased by two and one half percent (2.5%).

6.4 Effective September 1, 2014, the daily rate shall be increased by two and one half percent (2.5%).

6.5 All active, permanent, full-time School Crossing Guards shall be paid at the straight time rate for those days on which they are scheduled to work and are available to work but are prevented from working solely by virtue of severe storms that cause the school to which the crossing guard is assigned to be closed.

ARTICLE 7 - WEARING APPAREL

7.1 School Crossing Guards shall wear the uniform of blue coat and trousers/skirt during the winter months and white shirt and blue trousers/skirt in the fall and spring months.

7.2 School Crossing Guards shall, upon appointment, be provided with the following articles of uniform and equipment, in the amount and manner provided for in the following table:

1. One (1) glow vest
2. Two (2) gloves: (1) winter - (1) summer
3. One (1) Raincoat

7.3 Articles of uniform shall be replaced as needed based upon yearly departmental inspection. Any lost or stolen articles of uniform must be replaced by the employee at their own expense.

7.4 Effective September 1, 1997, all active School Crossing Guards returning shall receive a one hundred and sixty dollars (\$160.00) payment to be placed toward uniform items.

7.5 Upon discharge or resignation all issued equipment as referenced in Article 7.2 must be returned before a final paycheck will be issued.

7.6 The City will make every effort to purchase all equipment from a qualified vendor. The vendor will be expected to have a supply of equipment on hand.

ARTICLE VIII - VACATION

8.1 In each contract year, School Crossing Guards with three (3) or more years of service, but less than four (4) years of service, shall receive one (1) day vacation

(4)

with pay. School Crossing Guards with four (4) or more years of service but less than ten (10) years of service shall receive three (3) days vacation with pay.

In each contract year, School Crossing Guards with ten (10) or more years of continuous service, but less than fifteen (15) years of such service shall receive four (4) days vacation with pay. In each contract year employees with fifteen (15) but less than twenty (20) years of service shall receive five (5) days vacation with pay. In each contract year employees with twenty (20) or more years of continuous service shall receive six (6) days vacation with pay.

8.2 Vacation time can only be taken when school is not in session.

ARTICLE IX - INSURANCE

9.1 The City shall provide and pay for the cost of five (5) thousand dollars (\$5,000) Group Term Life Insurance and accidental Death and Dismemberment Policy (double indemnity) for all School Crossing Guard Employees.

ARTICLE X - SICK LEAVE

10.1 Sick Leave Allowance - Sick leave shall be earned by each employee of the Association, at the rate of one working day for each calendar month of service, the total of which shall not exceed ten (10) days for each school year.

10.2 A medical certificate acceptable to the appointing authority, will be required for any absence consisting of four (4) or more consecutive working days.

10.3 All active School Crossing Guards shall, after ten (10) years of service, shall receive fifty percent (50%) of their accumulated sick time at retirement or termination provided they leave in good standing up to a maximum amount of two hundred (200) days. Effective September 1, 1996, the maximum will be increased to

two hundred ten (210) days. Upon the death of the employee, the amount of sick leave time credited to the employee shall be payable to his/her spouse, and/or children, or estate.

10.4 Any employee who works an entire school year without taking time off for any purpose, excluding time taken between the date of death and date of funeral for a member of the employee's immediate family (For the purpose of this Article the term immediate shall mean and include the following: Mother, father, spouse, mother-in-law, father-in-law, sister, brother, child, grandparents, grandchildren, aunt, uncle, sister-in-law and brother-in-law) shall receive a two hundred dollars (\$200.00) lump sum payment. Said payment shall be made during the last month of the spring term.

10.5 The City of Bridgeport Attendance Policy that became effective on April 1, 2000 and all its subsequent amendments, modifications and replacements as determined by the City are incorporated into this contract.

ARTICLE XI - COPIES OF THE CONTRACT

11.1 Within ninety (90) days after the signing of this Agreement, the City shall furnish a copy of this Agreement to each employee. New Employees shall be given a copy of this Agreement at the time of hire. The Association is to receive ten (10) signed copies of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XII - SAVINGS CLAUSE

12.1 If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Agreement shall be held, for any reason to be inoperative, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby, it being the intention of the parties

in adopting this Agreement that no portion thereof, or provision herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of invalidity of any other portion or provisions

ARTICLE XIII - DRUG TESTING

13.1 The City reserves the right to conduct drug and alcohol testing as provided in Connecticut General sections 31-51st through 31-55bb, inclusive excluding section 31-51v.

The City shall provide the union thirty (30) days notice prior to the implementation of Drug and Alcohol testing.

ARTICLE XIV - TERMINATION

14.1 This agreement shall be effective the first of September, 2010 and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of August, 2015.
