The Elderly Hispanic Program provides information and assistance, available in both Spanish and English, to Bridgeport seniors. Program staff assess the needs of all Seniors by conducting a brief eligibility screening and informing them of the latest information on opportunities and services available at the state and local level. The Program Coordinator assists seniors to remedy issues as time permits. Seniors in need of further assistance are referred according to relevant community organizations to provide specialized services. The Elderly Hispanic Program is committed to ensuring that each client is served in both a welcoming and culturally sensitive environment.

Municipal Profile

The City of Bridgeport is in Fairfield County at the mouth of the Pequonnock River on Long Island Sound. It is bordered by the towns of Trumbull to the north, Fairfield to the west, and Stratford to the east. The most populous city in Connecticut, it has an approximate population of 147,000, consisting of 50,367 households, with a population density of 9,226 residents per square mile. Nicknamed the "Park City" for its over 40 public parks, including the Olmsted-designed Seaside Park and Beardsley Park, Bridgeport is a vibrant community, and was recently cited as the 11th most diverse city in the country (with some 85 languages spoken here). *NBC Today* also

labeled Bridgeport one of the [top 5 booming cities in the nation](#). The City is also home to numerous attractions, such as the [Barnum Museum](#), [Connecticut's Beardsley Zoo](#), the [Hartford Healthcare Amphitheater](#), the [Total Mortgage Arena](#), and the [Soundside Music Festival](#), all of which bring thousands of visitors to the city each year for a myriad of events. A center of learning, Bridgeport is home to Sacred Heart University's Center for Healthcare Education, the University of Bridgeport, and Fairfield University's Bellarmine Campus, as well as the campus of the Paier College of Art and the Housatonic Community College. The city also hosts two major medical centers which serve the region and are the city's largest employers: Bridgeport Hospital, which is part of the Yale New Haven Health Care System, and Saint Vincent's Medical Center, which is part of Hartford Healthcare. The [Connecticut's Beardsley Zoo](#) is one of the most visited tourist attractions and only zoo in the State. The [Sacred Heart University's Discovery Museum and Planetarium](#), located in the North End of the City, offers interactive science and space displays. Additionally, Bridgeport is home to a [Vinny Brand's Stress Factory Comedy Club](#), [Downtown Cabaret Theatre](#), and many [fine dining](#) options.

Governing Structure

The City has a Mayor-City Council form of government. Bridgeport has an elected mayor who serves as the chief executive officer of the municipal government and serves a four-year term. The current mayor is Joseph P. Ganim, who is currently serving his eighth term as mayor. The City Council is the twenty-member legislative body whose two major responsibilities are enacting ordinances necessary to ensure the welfare and good order of the City and adopting the City's [annual budget](#). Councilmembers are elected by the residents of the ten council districts to represent the concerns, needs, and issues of their constituents, and work to improve the City's neighborhoods. All Councilmembers serve a two-year term in office.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES:

The Elderly Hispanic Program Coordinator will provide one-on-one benefits counseling to Medicare eligible beneficiaries and their caregivers. The coordinator also does outreach and group level presentations throughout the community, completes Form 5s on each client, and enters data into a database for Southwestern Connecticut Agency on Aging.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- **One-on-One Counseling**
 - Works both diligently and patiently with each Spanish-speaking senior to provide them with the proper evaluation, resources, and information that they need.
 - Conducts home visits for seniors who have limited mobility so they too can take advantage of the benefits they are entitled to.
 - Provides referrals to appropriate agencies which enables individuals to access needed services such as financial assistance, nursing home, transportation, home care, nutrition, adult daycare, etc.
- **Outreach**
 - Outreach conducted throughout Bridgeport to promote the Elderly Hispanic Program.
- **Group level presentations**
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Medicaid and Medicaid Waivers
 - Energy Assistance
 - Caregiver Program
 - CT Home Care Program for Elders
- **Manage grant reporting and deliverables**
 - Work closely with Health Department staff to prepare reports for and communicate with State funders.
 - Keep appropriate records for all grant-funded activities.

- Ensure requirements for grant deliverables are understood and presented to funders on schedule.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be familiar with Medicare, Medigap, Medicare Managed Care, Medicaid, Long Term Care Insurance and other state & federal programs.
- Must possess excellent networking, listening, organizational and writing skills
- Must have the ability to self-motivate and coordinate work with collaboratives.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:

- The ability to speak, read, and write in Spanish is preferred.
- Bachelor's degree is social work, counseling, or human services.
- Excellent organizational skills.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- Highly proficient with Microsoft Office and general computer skills.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The conditions below are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of the job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

- Essential and marginal functions may require maintaining the physical condition necessary for sitting for prolonged periods of time. Frequent downward flexion of neck, side-to-side turning of the neck, fine finger dexterity and grasp to manipulate the keyboard, telephone, writing instruments, papers, books, manuals, and reports.
- Ability to see and read objects closely, such as typing from another document, reading/proofreading a report, read plans, using a computer monitor, filing and/or retrieving information from a filing system and verifying the accuracy of financial information.

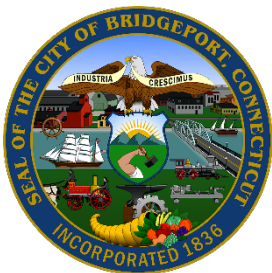
